Charity Committee Update

Our charity committee meets every week with Mrs Ahlner to discuss ideas for charity fundraising.

Taking ideas from the student body, they discuss with Mrs Ahlner their ideas and develop the best ways to help the charities (locally, nationally and internationally) that we have chosen.

The group then undertake a great deal of work personally to raise money for charity. They also encourage their forms to get involved. Here is their latest update:

Change for Change

Our Change for Change collection in the bistro at break and lunchtimes is going well! So far students have donated over £100 in small change which will be added to our account with 'Lend with Care'. People in difficult circumstances in developing countries approach the charity for a loan to help them develop their business ideas and therefore become self sufficient. As they begin to make a profit, so they repay their loan and the whole process starts again with the money being lent to new people. The charity committee decides who they will lend their money to; currently we sponsor two individuals, both of whom have repaid about 50% of



their loan to date. Once the money has been banked with 'Lend with Care' the committee will be deciding who next to sponsor. Thank you to every single student and member of staff who has donated to the collection to help raise such a fantastic amount.

Jump rope with heart!

Becket Keys Charity Committee is organising for every student to take part in a sponsored skip to raise funds for the British Heart Foundation and the school charities. Each student will take part in a sponsored skip to be held in PE lessons during the week of the 14th October. Students will have 2 minutes to do as many skips as they can, and will be sponsored per skip. If every student raises £5 then as a school we would raise £1800! Of this, 80% would go to the British Heart Foundation and 20% to our school charities. Sponsor forms will be given to every student by the end of this week, and they have a week to collect sponsorship before the week of the 14th October. Information about the collection of money will be given after the event. This will be our first ever sponsored event at Becket Keys, so let's make it a fantastic one!

Coming up in the next month: voting for the school charities this year, food bank collection for Harvest Festival, operation Christmas Child (start collecting your shoe boxes!), the poppy

appeal, other fund raising events.
