DIGGING DEEPER INTO LEARNING

Becket Keys Church of England School staff and students enjoyed a fantastic day of learning today with visitors joining us from various organisations and every student 'off timetable'.

In Year 7, the enrichment day was called 'Digging Deeper' with students experiencing a day of learning about how we humans have developed an understanding of the past through archaeology and geology. Historians from Chelmsford Museum led students in what they call a 'blanket dig'. Dr Paul Taylor joined us from the Natural History Museum to talk about fossils and what they can tell us about ancient life. He also helped students to investigate their own fossils.

Year 8 students had a day of inspiration from their tutors. They spent the day looking at the importance of entrepreneurial enterprise and examining how their future careers may be to work as innovators in what is probably the largest caring organisation in the world: the National Health Service.

Students gained a great deal from the activities and we would like to thank those who came to assist with this excellent day.



Phase 2 of refurbishment: DONE

We celebrated the completion of phase 2 of the refurbishment works with a small celebration today. Guests who so far had not had a chance to see the completed works were invited to join our MP, Eric Pickles today. We were also delighted to be joined by Bishop John Wraw and Brentwood Mayor Councillor Madeline Henwood.

Students gave tours and our choir and orchestra prepared a number of musical items for guests to enjoy in the new Becket Bistro, while others assisted by serving drinks and canapés to the guests. These included various local ministers, clergy, business leaders and, of course, the enormous team of

contractors, architects, surveyors and advisers who have made the £4.5million refurbishment possible.

Mr Pickles spoke of the importance of Free Schools to communities and of his pride in having the largest Free School in the country in his constituency.

Mr Scott-Evans thanked those who had worked so hard to complete the project and gave the assembled guests an insight into the distinctive nature of our school.

Father Colin (our parish priest) finished with a prayer of blessing. It was a fantastic occasion and a time to reflect on God's faithful goodness to our school.
