## DEPOSITS 'FLY IN' FOR BUSHCRAFT

Becket Keys Church of England School students are signing up in their droves for the Year 7 Bushcraft Trip this week. The trip, which takes place in May next year, will take our students and staff to Cornbury Park in Oxfordshire which is the largest privately owned woodland in the country for a weekend of bushcraft training.

The well established and highly respected 'Bushcraft Company' will be hosting us for the weekend and will train our students in key elements of bushcraft: building and lighting fires, creating shelters, cooking over open fires, freshwater swimming, orienteering, emergency first aid and trap setting.

With the full cost of the trip set at only £155, deposits of £50 are coming in quickly and students are already discussing the important matters like: 'who will be in whose tent?!\*'

When designing the trip we wanted a challenge for our year 7 students and we certainly got one last year! This trip takes everyone out of their comfort zone and into the world of 'Duke of Edinburgh' type experiences. It is, we believe, an important first foray for many into life skills that are sometimes now overlooked or forgotten.

#### **IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDING NOTICE**

A parent contacted us on Thursday afternoon to state that two girls from Becket Keys had been approached by a man at 3.38pm after school. They were waiting on the corner of Tree Tops to be collected. The man was asking them questions about Becket Keys, but when their mother arrived, he walked away quickly which the mother thought was suspicious. The man was described as being 50–60 yrs old, grey/black curly hair which was short and bushy on top, black/grey bushy eye brows, wearing dark rimmed glasses and a dull green long mac/coat. Police were informed and PC Tansley made a search of the area – but no one meeting the description was seen. Becket Keys staff will be patrolling the area for the next few days. As always, we advise students who are concerned to come back to school, stay in groups and approach other students/parents for help if they are anxious.
