Meanwhile, Year 8s were inspired by a visit from staff from Chelmsford Museum who presented artefacts and activities based on the Tudor period.


At lunchtime, Fr Colin

UNIFORM POLICY

EARRINGS

Girls may only wear plain gold or silver stud earrings.

NO MAKE-UP

Girls may only wear discreet concealer to cover blemishes. No other make-up is acceptable.

NO TIPPEX

Students do not need correction fluid. Moreover, it is not allowed on the school site and must be left at home. Instead, students who wish to be really neat can use correction tape. Our preference, however, is simply to draw a single line through mistakes!

You will be able to leave a short message on the answer phone stating the name of your son/daughter, form and reason for absence. You can also leave a message here if your son/daughter is going to be late.

AUTHORISED ABSENCE
