
UK MATHEMATICS TRUST - TEAM CHALLENGE

On Tuesday this week our mathematics team travelled to Cambridge University's Centre for Mathematical Sciences to compete in the UK Mathematics Trust (UKMT) National Team Competition.

28 teams from across the South East England region competed in the event, which comprised 4 different rounds; more details about the different elements are below.

We scored 42/60 in the group round, 41/56 in the crossnumber round, 30/60 in the shuttle round and 34/60 in the relay round. With a score of 147/236 we

finished in a very respectable 11^{th} place! All the other schools had two Year 9s in their team; we will be able to do that next year and we hope that they can put in an even stronger performance.



Mr Scott-Evans said: "This is a tremendous achievement for our 'young' school and I am delighted with the performance and determination of our Y8 team. We look forward to more opportunities like this and would like to thank Mrs Rowan for taking the team to Cambridge to compete against these other high performing schools."



Group Competition

Teams work to solve ten questions of varying type and difficulty. The team must decide their own strategy: whether to work in pairs, individually or as a team, to answer the questions in the time allowed.

Cross number

A cross number is similar to a crossword but with numerical answers. Teams work in pairs. One pair has the across clues, and the other pair has the down clues. Pairs work independently to complete the grid using logic and deduction.

Shuttle (previously called Mini Relay)

Teams compete against the clock to answer correctly a series of four questions. Each team is divided into Pair A (given Questions 1 and 3) and Pair B (given Questions 2 and 4). Question 1 can be solved independently of the others, but the answer to each subsequent question is dependent on the previous answer, referred to as T in Questions 2, 3 and 4 (e.g. "T is the number that you will receive.")

Relay Race

Teams split off into pairs, with pairs taking it in turns to solve problems. This event involves lots of movement as well as mathematics. It is a race against the clock with lots of lively activity and excitement.
