Centenary Celebrations



'Parkrun'

'Parkrun' is a 5km semi-competitive run hosted in different parks around the country. Anyone can join with arrival at 8.50am ready for the starting whistle at 9.00am. Currently there are 'Parkruns' in Hornchurch, Basildon and Chelmsford. On Sundays at 9.00am, Hornchurch and Chelmsford also have a Junior 'Parkrun' which is a 2km race.

This is a fantastic event to take part in regularly as not only will your fitness improve significantly but your 5km/2km time will get quicker and quicker.

As you finish the race, a marshall will give you a finishing barcode. This, along with your personal barcode should then be scanned by another official. You can then go home. A few hours later, you will receive an email with your time, position, whether it was your personal best or not and other interesting facts about your race.

Why not speak to your parents and see if they will take you to a 'Parkrun' with some of your friends and see how you get on? A great way to start a Saturday. You'll be done 9.30am and hopefully home by 10am.
