Becket Keys v Ormiston

After winning our first game of the season against Chelmer Valley, we travelled nearly 40 miles to play Ormiston Rivers. Then with our next attack a ball was squared across the box for Bradley Powell to score from close range on his debut for the school.

Tiwa's pace down the left proved too much for the Ormiston defence and after a couple of failed attempts on goal, he found the net twice! In the second half, Cooper struck the ball well to score from outside the box to make it 5. We did concede 2 goals during the game which we were disappointed with, but credit should be given to their striker who took the chances well. Harrison made a good penalty save during the first half and distributed well. All the substitutes were used and had a good impact on the game.



Becket Keys v Sandon

The Year 7 Boys' football team had a tough game against Sandon, showing great character to claw their way back into the game and take a win. Sandon took the lead with a well-worked goal after a spell of pressure early in the first half. Becket Keys knew that they could get their way back into the game and persevered with patient build-up and possession. They got their reward when Bobby Bailey was played through on goal and finished superbly. At half-time, the team spoke about defending from the front and quickening the tempo in possession. This plan worked, as Becket Keys were able to close opposing players down higher up the pitch to break through a number of times in the second half, despite Sandon having more possession.

The winning goal came 5 minutes from the end, with Bobby Bailey finishing a great team move, and Becket Keys were able to hold out for the win. Jack Giddings had an excellent debut in goal and Todd Miller was man-of-the-match at centre back. Becket Keys were complimented by the opposing coach for the spirit and sportsmanship they showed throughout, and the team are hoping to build on this great start to the season.
