# Sixth Form Update

## **Medicine Workshop**

Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> November 2pm or 4pm

Dr Sarah Lynch is a junior doctor (F2) at the University Hospital of Wales in Cardiff. She attended a comprehensive school in Surrey (where she studied A levels in Chemistry, Biology, Politics and AS French) and then studied Medicine at Cardiff University. (which has been ranked third among the UK's medical schools after Oxford and Cambridge for two of the last three years). She will talk about the life of a medical student and then junior doctor. She will also help students to examine the qualities needed to be a doctor. Dr Sarah Lynch will then outline the process of applying to university for Medicine and what to do between now and then whilst attending Sixth Form at Becket Keys to ensure a successful application.



Once again the Main Hall was packed with parents and students interested in the new Sixth Form, which will be opening in September 2017. Excitement is growing as we see the new purpose built Sixth Form centre gradually being built.

Mr Scott-Evans spoke about applying to the Sixth Form online, the admissions process should we be oversubscribed, the new course guide and gave an update on the construction work.

There are exciting workshops and events being planned; the first of which is for those students who are interested in pursuing Medicine.

#### MOBILE PHONES IN SCHOOL

We have had a few incidents recently where a number of staff and students have been filmed without their consent on camera phones.

This is a serious violation of trust and privacy and is obviously unacceptable.

Everyone has the right to come and work and learn at Becket Keys, feeling safe without fear of being secretly filmed or photographed.

In response, we are needing to take a much stronger stance on all use of mobile phones in the school. This is necessary to keep everyone safe.

From now on, if students have their phone out during the school day, we will be taking them and recording the fact on their file on SIMS.

If it is the first incident, they will get the phone back at the end of the school day.

If it is the second incident, we will keep the phone overnight.

If it is the third incident, we will keep the phone for a week.

If it the fourth incident, we will keep the phone over the weekend.

After that, you will be banned from bringing your phone into school at all.

If this happens and you bring your phone in anyway, you will be facing an exclusion.
