Patronal Festival

Yesterday, the school went to St Thomas of Canterbury church for our Patronal Festival Mass. Father Colin led the service and spoke about the life of St Thomas à Becket and how his life changed miraculously when he became the Archbishop of Canterbury. He changed from being a servant of the King to a servant of God. Thomas à Becket is, of course, one of our Patron Saints, the other being St Peter. Both set the example of a life lived (with all its imperfections) as a sacrifice to God.

Whilst I have been thinking and preparing for the Patronal Festival (which started with the beautiful concert at St Peter's last week), the words that keep coming to my mind are from JF Kennedy's inaugural speech in 1961: "Ask not

what your country can do for you; ask what you can do for your country." Or in our context: "Ask not what Becket Keys can do for you; ask what you can do for Becket Keys."

A Saint would always want to put the needs of others first. I have seen so many examples of this recently. I would like to share a few with you today.

Firstly, our students have been serving our community. In the Lower School students have been visiting the local primary schools teaching the Year 6 students about life in secondary school. Regardless of which secondary school they are choosing, we have gone and helped nervous Year 6s prepare for the big step to Year 7 working with the Brentwood Schools Christian Worker Trust.
