I was speaking to some Year 7s outside school yesterday and teaching them NOT to walk past pieces of litter on the path, but the pick them up and put them in the bin. If we can get students into these good habits early on – we can teach them the real joy of being responsible and seeing the world as a better place because of what you do yourself.

Life in all its fullness


At a Church School Leadership Conference in June, the Chelmsford Diocesan Board of Education encapsulated their vision in a simple statement based on the words of John 10:10 - Life in all its fullness. Over the holidays, with an opportunity to reflect, it became apparent to me how significant this statement was in expressing the distinct Christian character of our school. What is it like to live a life of faith which is an abundant life – life in all its fullness? Life in all its fullness is NOT a new car and the latest iphone, it is the sort of life in which we begin to sense the possibility of a God of love; the sort of life Jesus lived, forgiving His tormentors; the sort of life he calls his followers to live. Sensing the possibility of God's love relates the time given to daily prayer and worship at Becket Keys. As a Church of England School, we are not just concerned with academic success, but also providing opportunities for spiritual and character growth. Spirituality is derived from the

Hebrew 'ruach' which has a range of meanings; spirit, breath and wind. All of these give life and animation to things. In its most fundamental sense, spirituality is about becoming fully human, fully alive. Traditionally, spirituality has been associated with God, prayer and church, but permeates every aspect of living and so also has to do with creativity, art, music and serving others. In this sense, it affects the whole life of the school and all members of the school community.



At Becket Keys, we have a definite understanding of spirituality being deeply rooted in the Christian tradition. Our basis for everything we do comes from our faith in Jesus Christ, who offers himself for the life of the world. We are confident in the message of Jesus who teaches that all things are possible in and through our belief in God. We do recognise, however, that spirituality is a broad concept with room for other perspectives. We seek to learn from one another. In hearing about others' experiences of faith, we come to a better understanding of our own.

Our form of Christian spirituality is such that it deepens a sense of connection to something greater than ourselves. In our worship of God, we seek to give an experience of the transcendence; looking beyond ourselves, so that we can have a relationship with God and in so doing learn how we are connected through him to one another. We use the teachings of the Bible, the example of Jesus and the teachings of the Church to help students of all faiths and none consider and ask of themselves deep questions about the meaning of life. We seek to promote an education that allows Jesus' promise of 'life in all its fullness'. An education that enables every person to flourish in the widest sense: to grow in wisdom; to cultivate a wideranging knowledge that will broaden life chances; to develop the spiritual, intellectual and emotional resources they need to live a good life and to develop the character to live well in a community.





As a Church of England School, we have deep sense of Christian community. The spiritual dimension of our life together is of vital importance. We offer an engaging curriculum, a stimulating learning environment as well as trusting and loving relationships. Relationships are indeed key:

- Relationship with ourselves how we use our talents, skills, emotions and what we think about ourselves and our life.
- Relationships with others how we relate to other people be they students, staff, parents, Governors, visitors and the wider community.
- Relationship with the environment and the awesomeness of God's creation.
- Relationship with God.

We introduce students to new and different experiences and opportunities in order to 'grab the moment' and see the world 'in the eye of the beholder' with those 'first ever experiences' – forest school, water sports, skiing, trips abroad, fieldtrips into the outdoors, a new game or sport, an experiment of discovery in science, the joy in solving a maths equation, creating something beautiful from nothing, that first time a passage from a book or play makes sense or reading a poem that is moving and wonderful. On a daily basis, giving students time, space and stillness to build a relationship with God, find for themselves the person God wants them to be. Allowing students to make mistakes along the way and know forgiveness when they are truly sorry.



The words of Ephesians 3:17-19 come to mind. 'That you, being rooted and grounded in love . . . may have strength to comprehend . . . the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge to be filled with the fullness of God'. As a school, we bear fruit because we are deeply rooted in Christ.

Let us pray:

Meet Some More New Becket Keys Staff – Welcome!

Firstly, thank you to all the staff and students at Becket Keys for making me feel so welcome and for helping me to settle in. Even after such a short time here I can tell that Becket Keys is a great place to work and to learn, a really caring and inclusive community.

Now – a bit about me! I have come here as a humanities teacher with responsibility for coordinating Christian worship. This is a hugely exciting prospect for me as it marries together my past experiences, skills and enthusiasm.

Before coming to Becket Keys, I taught for 8 Years at a comprehensive school in the London Borough of Redbridge. Having graduated with a BTh in Theology, I trained to teach Religious Education. However, at

my previous school I taught across the humanities - in RE, PSHCE, Geography and History. I was also Head of House promoting the school's ethos and encouraging pupils.

I became increasingly interested in the philosophical aspects of Religious Studies and have just completed an MA in Philosophy and Education from Heythrop College, which is the specialist philosophy and theology arm of the University of London. I am really excited to be teaching in the RP and Geography departments here.

Having grown up fairly agnostic I became a Christian when I was 16 (in my GCSE English exam as a matter of fact - ask me about it if you see me!). Since then I have tried to live out my faith by working alongside people to make a difference in the lives of others. This has mostly been through youth work both within the Church and overseas. When I was 18 I undertook a gap year living and working in a children's home in Transylvania with a Christian charity called the Oasis Trust.

Whilst at university I undertook a double module in 'Skills for Christian Ministry' where I went to Zambia for 10 months, living in a small town on the Copperbelt and started a children's ministry in the church there. I also taught Grade 1 at the local primary school which gave me my first taste of teaching - there were 50 children aged 5-7 and no chalk in my classroom! Thankfully my
