Bude 2018 was the Year 9 trip, hosted by Adventure International. We were the first school group (second group overall) of the year for the centre. Taking centre stage was most clearly the activities. High ropes, climbing, abseiling, surfing, kayaking, canoeing, dragon boating, team trail, bodyboarding, mountain biking and mountain boarding were the activities available to us on the trip. I, personally, considered high ropes as the most enjoyable, which was my first activity - but I think there was a wide range of favourites amongst all the opportunities. This we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord Amen


# Friends of Becket Keys
