Mrs Sharp writes:

Made for mission

Our English word 'mission' comes from the Latin word for 'sending'. Being a Christian includes being sent into the world as a representative of Jesus Christ. Jesus said, 'As the Father has send me, I am sending you' (John 20:21). This week we have been delighted to welcome the 'American team'; a group of young Christians from the USA who have shared their faith and demonstrated their Christian values. They have achieved this through discussion of ethical issues in Religion and Philosophy lessons (with students of all ages), presentations, testimonies, sketches, worship, music and attendance of High School Musical rehearsals.

Feedback from Mr. Silver:

'I had the pleasure of hosting our American missionary friends in three lessons with Years 9 and 10. Their visit in the classroom made a great impact, both with their numbers (on one occasion there were 13 in the class) and their openness and clear love and care for our students. Their topics were prejudice and discrimination, and sexual abstinence. Our students love visitors in the classroom and these Americans were no exception. They presented their ideas powerfully and interestingly through personal testimonies and in group work with the students who were able then to give their own views and insights. What struck me most of all was the youth of the Americans. Many of them were in their mid-teens and

To hear them speak about their own faith story with courage and conviction was a real privilege and made me think of 1 Timothy 4:12: 'Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith and in purity.' That is exactly the example for American friends set, and I for one hope to meet them again.'

Inspirational Speaker and ex NBA basketballer Bay Forrest has also visited us again this week to speak to other year groups about Ephesians 5v1 - a call to be imitators of Christ. He encouraged students to look at Christ's life in the Bible and to see God's purpose in everything created.

EVERY TEMPTATION IS AN OPPORTUNITY TO DO GOOD



In the last Biblical Pause, we looked at how our school helps to grow strong foundations in Christ. Our seven values help us to live guided by God's Word and following the example of Jesus. We show respect and responsibility by being trustworthy, honest, caring, fair and forgiving. This does not mean that living out our Christian values is easy and that we are never tempted to do the wrong thing. However, through our path to spiritual maturity, even temptation becomes a steppingstone, rather than a stumbling block when you realise it is just as much an occasion to do the right thing as it is to do the wrong thing. Temptation simply provides the choice. Every time you do the right things instead of sin, you grow in the character of Christ.

REAL FAITH LIVED OUT

THE TRIALS OF LIFE, JAMES 1:1-12

'Happy is the man who doesn't give in and do wrong when he is tempted, for afterwards he will get as his reward the crown of life that God has promised those who love him.'



To understand this, you must first identify the character qualities of Jesus. One of the most concise descriptions of his character is the fruits of the Spirit:

'When the Holy Spirit controls our lives, he will produce this kind of fruit in us: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.'

Galatians 5:22-23

How then does the Holy Spirit produce these in your life? You will

not wake one day to find yourself fully developed with these characteristics. No. Fruit always matures and ripens slowly. God develops the fruits of the Spirit, by allowing you to experience circumstances in which you are tempted to express the exact opposite quality. Character development always involves choice and temptation provides opportunity. For instance, God teachers us love by putting some challenging people around us. It does not show character to love people who are lovely and loving to you. God teaches us real joy in the midst of sorrow, when we turn to him. Happiness can depend on external circumstances, but joy is based on your relationship with God. God develops real peace within us, not by making things the way we planned, but by allowing times of chaos and confusion. Anyone can be peaceful watching a beautiful sunset or relaxing on holiday! We learn real peace by choosing to trust God in circumstances in which we are

tempted to worry or be afraid. Likewise, patience is developed in circumstances in which we are forced to wait and are tempted to be angry or have a short fuse. God uses the opposite situation of each fruit to allow us a choice. You cannot claim to be good, if you have never been tempted to be bad. You cannot claim to be faithful, if you have never had the opportunity to be unfaithful. Integrity is built by defeating the temptation to be dishonest; humility grows when we refuse to be prideful; and endurance develops every time you reject the temptation to give up. Every time you defeat a temptation, you become more like Christ.

Understanding how temptation works is in itself helpful, but there are three specific steps you need to take to overcome it:

- 1. Refuse to be intimidated: We should not be discouraged by it. The Bible says 'when you are tempted' not if. Paul advises, 'remember that the temptations that comes into your life are no different from what others experience' (1 Corinthians 10:13). It is not a sin to be tempted. Temptation is only a sin when you give in to it. Jesus himself was tempted (Mark 1:9-15, Mark 4:1-11). It is turning away from sins and believing the Good News which makes the difference!
- Recognise your pattern of temptation and be prepared: There are certain situations that make you more vulnerable to temptation than others.
 Some circumstances will cause

you to stumble almost immediately, while others do not bother you much. These relate to where you are, the time of day, who is with you and how you feel. Plan for these situations or avoid them. Refocus your attention on something else.

3. Request God's help:



Heaven has a twenty-four-hour emergency hotline! God want us to ask him for assistance in overcoming temptation. He says, 'Call on me in times of trouble. I will rescue you, and you will honour me' (Psalm 50:15). This does not have to be a long conversation with God. A mini prayer, a quick call for help, is all that is needed. An S.O.S is all it takes! The Bible guarantees that our cry for help will be heard because Jesus is sympathetic to our struggle.

Remember, temptation keeps us dependent upon God. Just as the roots grow stronger when wind blows against a tree, so every time you stand up to temptation, you become more like Jesus. When you stumble, which we all do, it is not fatal. Instead of giving in or giving up, look up to God, expect him to help and remember the reward that awaits you:

'When people are tempted and still continue strong they should be happy. After they have proved their faith, God will reward them with life everlasting.'

James 1:12

Let us pray:

Dear Lord, I believe that You will help me stand strong when I am tempted to do wrong. I believe You will give me the words and actions to do the right thing. I believe that if I pause a moment and ask, You will help me. I believe that You will strengthen me, protect me and guide me. I believe I can be more like You.

Lord I ask that you continue to remind me how important it is to invite your presence daily into my life and circumstances. I lift up to you my relationships with others. Bring these into your loving arms. Please show me the way to let go, to forgive and to set free. Protect and preserve me from all misunderstanding and miscommunication. Give me compassion and forgiveness, so that I may value and use the love that you have given me.

Lord, thank you for loving and accepting me. You proved your love on the cross and your acceptance by filling us with your spirit. Thank you that you have welcomed me into your presence. Help me to love and accept the people you have placed in my life. Lord thank you that, because of your love, you have already decided that through the gift of your Son we are set free, our sins are forgiven. How great is your grace. **Amen.**

Sixth Form Trip Rathbones




Becket Keys science department would like to invite you and your family to a science show by The Royal Institution.

Year 10 Textiles



Students produced a wide range of different work including wall hangings, cushions, bags, skirts, bodices and art textiles. I am really pleased with the beautiful work they produced.




