However, we need more funds for trees, benches, shelters and equipment like basketball hoops and table tennis tables.

I sit in my office writing today looking out at our beautiful site and I am so grateful for all the hard work of the founders of this school in achieving a campus which has an 'independent school feel'. We even have a family of

peacocks! However, there is a huge expanse of grass waiting to be developed and we need a little more finance to get this finished to the high standard we have come to expect for our students.

Students have been telling me this week that they need more spaces under cover to sit at lunchtime. They like being outside, but they want some shelter too. Furthermore, in a school where students love to play ball games and practise their skills, we need more facilities to enable this. We have Year 7s (for example Rylee and Reuben) playing table tennis without a table! They are so keen to practise that they just hit the ball back and forth letting it bounce on the playground!




most we could from the trip.


