Mr. Scott-Evans writes:

It has been another amazing term at Becket Keys Church of England School. I would like to start this newsletter by passing on my thanks to all of you for your support and encouragement.

I would like to thank all our staff who have been working incredibly hard again this term. The mocks (Year 11 and 13) have gone extremely well and students are going to benefit hugely when we return after Christmas from all the insights our staff have gained from these. Other assessments have also been completed this term and interim reports will be published after Christmas so you

can see how your son/daughter is getting on.

In sport, music, drama, arts, languages and right across the curriculum students are learning rapidly and effectively – it is a joy to walk around our school and see the hard work that goes on every day. With this in mind, I thought it would be good to end the year with a small round up of some of the things of which we are most proud.

Therefore, I contacted all of our Heads of Department and Heads of Year asking them for their 'best bits' and 'highlights' and here are some of the things they came up with.

Food:


Year 10 students made "Bake Off" style "Showstopper Cakes!"

Geography:

This term in Geography, the 6th Form students attended a memorable and rewarding trip to the Lake District National Park to undertake their fieldwork investigations. This was an excellent chance to recap and embed their learning and to gather primary data for the individual projects.

The Sixth Formers have since been working hard on writing up their findings which accounts for 20% of their A-Level Geography grade.

Year 8:

Instead of Secret Santa this year, the whole of Year 8 have been designing and making Christmas Cards for younger students at Grove House and St Thomas' Infant School.









A selection of Year 8 students then presented these cards to the students in an assembly at both schools

Mathematics:

In Years 7, 9 and 10 we have been looking at statistics and using graphs to analyse data. Year 12 and 13 have been exploring further trigonometry and calculus. All year groups have been making good use of mathswatch.vle this term, with many students making good progress towards their own personal targets. Well done to anyone who has managed to increase their usage over these few busy weeks!

Mrs Rubery has been running a "Cypher Club" open to all year groups; regular attendees have been competing against each other in a Kakuro competition!

Psychology:

Year 12 students have begun their psychological journey studying the methods employed to research and analyse behaviour. Since September, the Year 13 students have considered the various explanations for aggression, deepened their existing understanding of issues and debates, and more recently returned to research methods to complete their knowledge on this topic.



Drama



In drama, we have been exploring Pantomime with Year 7, 'Oh yes we have.' Whilst Year 10 gain the confidence and ability to perform the GCSE set text 'DNA' to the Year 11 GCSE drama students. In extracurricular, we have been practising the skills of role-play, improvisation and characterisation.



Year 9:

In Year 9, we have decided to collect money this year to donate to Brentwood foodbank for Christmas instead of the typical 'secret santa' gifts that many schools do. We decided that this was a better way to celebrate the true meaning of Christmas by helping out those in our local community who really need it.

We have been getting excited about the build-up to Christmas with our final two festive times of

Collective Worship outlining the story of Christmas and 9WW performed their assembly on what Christmas means to many people in the school community.

Dan Peters and Maddie Barker deserve a special mention, as their hard work and dedication have paid off in their cross country performances this year. Well done to them!

The Year 9s have also been getting excited about the two trip opportunities that they have coming up. Bude is a fabulous opportunity to develop team skills, confidence and risk taking. Science:

Millie Double and Lola Webb have achieved the Bronze CREST Award and we are entering a further three students this year. It is not too late to join our Advanced Science club on Tuesdays after school, if you would like to find out more about this exciting programme.

Music:

Our Chamber choir sang Handel's Messiah in the Albert Hall on December 2nd with the English Festival Orchestra and over a 1000 singers.



Year 12:

Our Year 12 students, now wellestablished in Becket Keys 6th Form and the wider school community, are continuing in their integral roles of responsibility around the school. As students ponder future plans, a number of visitors have provided insightful advice into the world of work and the options available for our students. From apprenticeship providers and Cambridge students to BBC directors and pioneers in the sporting industry students have had lots to think about. Next, students will be looking forward to a well-earned break before tackling the mock examinations in January.'

Religion & Philosophy:

Year 7 have been exploring the origins of Judaism and the importance of community for religious believers. Year 8 have been learning about how religions express their beliefs in society today and Year 9 have been developing their understanding of the Early Church and how the German and English Reformations have shaped Christianity today.





Sixth formers have been tackling various philosophical, ethical and theological issues which include arguments for the existence of God, theories on how people make ethical decisions and application of Christianity within the world today.

Worship:

It was wonderful to celebrate the end of the year with our whole school gathering for worship at St Thomas' Church and in the Main Hall for the Holy Eucharist. We have also enjoyed times of quiet and reflection every day through Advent and especially on Fridays for our special lunchtimes Eucharists.



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School Uniform



As we approach the end of another busy term, we would like to give you and your sons/daughters some reminders ready for the New Year to ensure our students are ready for a positive start in 2019.

Feedback from our families is crucial to our development; parents have mentioned to us that they appreciate consistency and firmness with regards to uniform and so with this in mind, we want to have a perfect start in 2019.

Make-up

Students in Years 7-9 are not permitted to wear any make up. The only make up allowed is concealer to cover up spots and blemishes, students who do wear make up to school will be asked to remove it.

For our older students, if false eyelashes and/or nails are coming for festive season, please do not book appointments before the break. Please also ensure all such items are removed prior to our return in January. Any students returning to school with false eyelashes and nails will be asked to remove them.

Bags & Coats

If students are asking for new bags and coats ready for the New Year, please ensure, in all cases, that these items are **black**.

Year 7 & 8 students must have Becket Keys bags from SmartyPants.
