Mr. Scott-Evans writes...

Whitsun

As we approach the Whitsun Holiday, I have been reading about the coming of the Holy Spirit and the beginning of the church, from Acts 2.

"42 All the believers devoted themselves to the apostles' <u>teaching</u>, and to <u>fellowship</u>, and to <u>sharing in meals</u> (including the <u>Lord's Supper</u>), and to <u>prayer</u>.

43 A deep sense of awe came over them all, and the apostles performed many miraculous signs and wonders. 44 And all the believers met together in one place and shared everything they had. 45 They sold their property and possessions and shared the money with those in need. 46 They worshiped together at the Temple each day, met in homes for the Lord's Supper, and shared their meals with great joy and generosity—47 all the while praising God and enjoying the goodwill of all the people. And each day the Lord added to

their fellowship those who were being saved."

As you can see, I have underlined a number of sections which I felt also describe, at least in part, our school community.

My hope is that our school will be a Christian community that reflects the good practices of the early church.

With some of the students this week, I spent time listening to their ideas about how we could become even more like the Christian community described here. We talked about a number of creative ideas. These included:

- Improvements to our 'place' in terms of the new green next to the playground.
- New ideas for enhancing our Patronal Festival Charities week

I would like to address each point in turn.

Green Space:

We have purchased some new table tennis tables, which arrived this week. There seems to be a fairly insatiable appetite for outdoor table tennis and so we may even purchase some more of these, using the funds we were so kindly given. We are also looking at some new covered seating areas to complement the already popular new wooden benches. We are working with two different companies looking at installing pathways, but we are trying to get the price down as if we are not careful this will use up a lot of the money we were given and it will not enhance students' experience very much.

Local community

I was stopped outside of school recently by a member of the public who wanted to point out how fantastic our students were. She said that they were always polite and respectful, apologising for taking up space on the paths. She had a very young child with her, and it was clear that she hoped that one day he would be a Becket Keys boy!

As we all know, it is very busy out in Sawyers Hall Lane and it is

somewhat of a miracle that our students behave as well as they do and that we have not suffered an accident out there. I have been pleased to see new 'enforcement' officers out there trying to tackle the illegal parking and dangerous driving. This will help.

We are regularly asking that some additional investment from Highways will be forthcoming and some improvements to the width of the path may be possible. In the meantime, it is up to our students to do everything they can to enjoy the 'goodwill of all the people'!

Patronal Festival Charities Week

When we return after Whitsun there will only be a couple of weeks left of June and then in July, we celebrate our Patronal Festival. As usual, this will include, Sports Day, Music Concerts, Governors' Speech and Awards Evening and a good number of fundraising activities for our school charities. Ecclesiastes 3:11a

This is what God the Lord says (the Creator of the heavens, who stretches them out, who spreads out the earth with all that springs from it, who gives breath to its people, and life to those who walk on it): 'I, the Lord, have called you in righteousness; I will take hold of your hand' (Isaiah 42:5-6).

Father Mark North comes in to school every Friday lunchtime to celebrate communion in the John Wraw Chapel (Justin Welby building).


All members of the local community and parents are also invited to these short twenty-minute services. Please arrive in reception at 12.50pm for a 1pm start.
