Quizzes, Y7 Discos, Wine Tasting, Golf Days and so on are all popular ways to bring the school community together and raise precious

There was a particularly encouraging report from the Treasurer this year as we celebrated our most successful year of fundraising. Over £25,000 had been donated to the school! £15,000 had been donated towards the new 'Green' next to the playground. New pods and a pavilion have been installed. Numerous new benches and table tennis tables have also been purchased. Some funds remain unused and we are looking to buy new Basketball hoops and Netball Goals. We also hope to plant some new trees and purchase additional henches

Everyone wants to help the school, but it is not always easy. There is however one thing that most parents can do quite easily. If you would like to raise money for the school without leaving the comfort of your home and not spending a single penny of your own money, read on!

All you need to do is make purchases on-line. If you shop on-line and would like to see the companies you shop with sharing their profits with our school – it can be done – very easily!

For a few years now I have had Easyfundraising set up on my home computer. And when I shop for anything online I raise a little bit of money for Becket Keys. I do not need to do much, the way I have it set up, it just does its thing in the

background, flagging up to me whenever I can claim a donation. Most of the time the shops that I use DO give a donation and it is very pleasing to click a single button and then see a small donation being clocked. It all adds up over time. I've now raised nearly £140 doing this. The school, in total has raised £1600. However, there are only 73 of us doing it! Imagine if everyone signed up! 

# New Hope Children's Centre

What an amazing place! New Hope Children's Centre Kenya creating new hope for 108 young people.

I have been privileged to visit New Hope Children's centre twice now; my last visit was at the end of the summer holidays just gone. The centre is based about an hour from Nairobi in a rural part of Kenya.



A typical day for me as a visitor starts by hearing most of the children at prayers at about 6am. Following a very simple breakfast of porridge, prepared for by one adult and the older children, they get ready to leave for school. The older teenagers have already left - they have an hour's journey to school and they have to be in by 7am to do private study. Whilst the older children are at school, I am taken to look around the area: I visit the local health centre, the 'Grandmothers' Village' – a whole community created when New Hope built two room houses for grandparents to move into, or to



provide a home for those young adults who have left New Hope.

I spend time at the baby unit, where babies and toddlers are cared for so that their young mothers can go back to school and finish their education.



I socialise with the young children as they return from Primary school at the end of the afternoon.

When the older children return around 5.30 or 6pm, I talk with them as they prepare the evening meal for the 100 or so children. I watch as they clear up afterwards, and then settle to their homework for perhaps 2 hours.

At the weekend, I talk with Sara as she washes her clothing, go to the local church service, spend more time with these incredible young people.

Set up in 2000 by Anne and Tyras Cheng, the centre has offered a home and a future to hundreds of young people. Some are street children, others are orphans, some have been rejected by their extended families. Some are in imminent physical danger.

Working with Hand in Hand, a local charity based in Witham, Becket Keys will be raising money to help New Hope and the local



Primary school provide basic support for food and clothing, but also resources such as school stationery equipment, play equipment and Christmas 'boxes' for each and every child.

The school will be supporting two charities this year: Cancer Research and New Hope Children's Centre

#### Cancer Research

- Is the world's largest charity dedicated to saving lives through research.
- Their vision is to bring forward the day when all cancers are cured.
- They receive no government funding, so they rely on our generosity to support their work.

#### Why was this chosen?

Approximately 38.4% of men and women will be diagnosed with **cancer** at some point during their lifetimes.

In 2017, an estimated 15,270 children and adolescents from birth to to 19 were diagnosed with **cancer**.

1,790 died of the disease.

Survival rates are now better than they have ever been – but they are just that – survival for a number of years not cure.

To beat cancer we have to research ways to both prevent it and cure it.

The four houses in the school will have a representative from each form in that house and will be led by a sixth form prefect to run charity events throughout the year for Cancer Research.

To start with, the forms have been set the following challenge:

<u>Can</u> your form fill a <u>can</u> with loose change before the All Saints holiday?

#### What your form needs to do:

- Someone bring in a cleaned can (baked bean or soup size).
- Everybody brings in some loose change whenever they <u>CAN</u>
- Your form fills the can with change before the holiday.

The maths: if every form raises £10 in their can then this equals £400 across the school. This is less than 50p per person in the form.

If every form raises £15 then it is £600!

The day after I introduced this to a year group, a student came to see me with £17.00 in change: he had gone around the house, emptied his own savings and persuaded his parents to donate their spare change.

 How we will support your preparation for the next steps after being in the Sixth Form.





Trials will be invite only and the date for this will be published later in the term.






