

Fair Trade Fortnight!

22 February to 7 March 21

For two weeks at the end of February and into March, thousands of people across the UK will come together to share stories of people who grow our food and drinks, mine our gold and who grow the cotton in our clothes. These people are often exploited and underpaid. This year it is slightly different. As campaigning cannot take place in person due to the COVID pandemic, the campaign this year is turning digital and you can get involved!

But what actually is Fair Trade?

Fairtrade is about better prices, decent working conditions, local sustainability, and fair terms of trade for farmers and workers in the developing world. By requiring companies to pay sustainable prices (which must never fall lower than the market price), Fairtrade tackles the injustices of conventional trade, which traditionally discriminates against the most vulnerable. It enables them to improve their position and have more control over their lives. You may have seen the Fairtrade logo on items that you buy from supermarkets,



such as bananas. This logo ensures that the farmers who produced the goods are given a sustainable price for their work, which improves their quality of life.

So how can I get involved?

If you are in Years 7 to 9, you will learn about Fairtrade in your Geography lessons next week; however, if you are interested in this there are a few things you can do individually on the website <https://www.fairtrade.org.uk/> such as:

- Sign up to the Fairtrade Festival with your friends and family and expect fascinating and fun events featuring all parts of our global Fairtrade community.
- Read the stories on the website about farmers

affected by climate change.

- Get involved in the 'Choose the World You Want' youth exhibition in Fairtrade Fortnight 2021.



Between them, this month they have completed over 800 practice questions (independent questions not set by their class teacher) and watched almost 100 videos.

Chocolate Brownies

Ingredients

- 250 g quality dark chocolate (70%)
- 250 g unsalted butter
- 4 large free-range eggs
- 250 g golden caster sugar
- 2 heaped tablespoons self-raising flour
- 2 heaped tablespoons quality cocoa powder

Method

Preheat the oven to 180°C/350°F/gas 4.

Tear off a large piece of greaseproof paper, scrunch it up under cold water, then unfold and use it to line a 20cm square baking tin.

Snap the chocolate into a heatproof bowl, dice the butter and add with a pinch of sea salt. Melt over a pan of gently simmering water, stirring regularly, then remove from the heat and leave to cool slightly.

Crack the eggs into a large bowl, then add the sugar and whisk until light, pale and fluffy.

Sieve in the flour, followed by the cocoa. Whisk to combine, then fold through the melted chocolate.

Spoon the mixture into the lined tin and spread it out evenly. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes, or until crisp on the outside but slightly wobbly.

Leave to cool in the tin for 15 minutes before slicing and serving warm – delicious with vanilla ice cream, crushed hazelnuts and caramel popcorn.

Follow your call



This week, I thought I would share and comment on an extract from the #LentLive daily resources produced by the Church of England (<https://www.churchofengland.org/our-faith/what-we-believe/lent-holy-week-and-easter/livelent-gods-story-our-story-our-lent>). Whatever stage you are on your faith journey, Lent is the perfect opportunity to walk more closely with Jesus and reflecting on Bible stories is a key part of this.

Bible reading

As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the lake—for they were fishermen. And he said to them, 'Follow me, and I will make you fish for people.' Immediately they left their nets and followed him.

Matthew 4.18-20

Reflection

Stories tell us who we are. They tell us where we belong. And they help us to decide who we want to be. When Jesus calls people, he does not call them to an interpretation of the religious law, but into a story. The story into which Jesus invites us is the story of God's loving engagement with the world. It is the story which begins with God's creation, continues through human wanderings towards and away from God, and reaches its dramatic peak in the coming of Jesus, the Word made flesh. The key word in Jesus' invitation is "follow." Walk in my footsteps, Jesus says, and make my story your story.

The invitation to Christian faith is always an invitation into the story of God, to make God's story our own, and to live out of that story. And here, right at the beginning, Jesus makes clear that accepting this invitation will entail inviting others in as well. "I will show you how to fish for people."

Prayer

Lord Jesus, thank you for the story of God into which you invite each of us. Help us to understand that story more fully this Lent, and to live it out each day. Amen.

Action for the week


Take time to reflect on how your own story of faith began.

I came across this beautiful prayer called 'Deeper listening' (Author unknown):



God of silence and God of all sound, help me to listen. Help me to do the deep listening to the sounds of my soul, waiting to hear your soft voice calling me deeper into you. Give me attentive ears that begin to separate the noise from the sounds that are you; you who have been speaking to me and through me my whole life, for so long that you can seem like background noise. Today help me hear you anew.

Amen.



Are you giving yourself time in the busyness and noise of the day to listen for God's voice? Are you listening for His call?

To follow Jesus implies we enter into a way of life that is given character, shape and direction by the One who calls us. Following Jesus means picking up rhythms and ways of doing things that are often unsaid but derived from Jesus. We need to listen and consider what Jesus is saying, but we also need to see what he is doing and how he is doing it. In this way, we bear witness to God's story and invite others into His story. In so doing, we make His story our own.


