Mrs Sharp Writes:

Fragile World

"A fragile world, entrusted by God to human care, challenges us to devise intelligent ways of directing, developing, and limiting our power."

Pope Frances, Encyclical Letter on Ecology, "Laudato Si" 2015

In the first chapters of the book of Genesis, we see that God invites us to share in creation through our unique relationship with the earth, and that God makes us to 'till it and keep it'. Our purpose is twofold; to enable the earth to be fruitful, and also to take care of it so that it will not be used up, but sustained for the future. In recent centuries, we have been good at 'tilling', but not so good at 'keeping' and we need to

remember this our dual vocation. We are also made in God's image, in the image of the creator, and so just as God carefully created the world to flourish, we are called to take our part in the goodness and flourishing of creation; cherishing, protecting and keeping what God values and calls good. Richard Bauckham, a Christian theologian, suggests we have for too long imagined a vertical structure to describe the relationship between God, humankind and creation, as though we human beings are somehow 'above' creation. Yet through the unique relationship God set out in Genesis, we can know ourselves to be part of a horizontal community of creation. We are not called to dominate over other creatures. plants or minerals, but rather to live in good relationship withContd on Page 2




Dear Lord,






Year 8 Trip 2022 – Manor Adventure





Please note this is the main trip for Year 8 this year, due to the uncertainty of foreign travel.

We are pleased to announce that Year 8 students will have the chance to go on an end of year trip to Norfolk Lakes, run by Manor Adventure!

This exciting trip will take place from Friday 27th May to Sunday 29th May 2022, leading into the Whitsun holiday.

Due to uncertainties around what travel will be possible with COVID, we are not undertaking any foreign trips this year so the Year 8 Madrid/China trips will not be taking place. However, this will be an exciting replacement trip, especially as students were unable to go to Bushcraft in year 7!

The trip overall costs £254 with a deadline for the £60 deposit by Friday 12th November; **this deadline has been extended by 1 week** in case there was any confusion over the Madrid/China trips still running.

Manor Adventure has been operating since 1991, now in 7 different locations, with Norfolk Lakes opening in 2016. This adventure trip will give students the opportunity to learn new skills outside of the classroom that will benefit everyone enormously by developing inner confidence, social skills and teamwork through trying new activities.

Throughout the 3-day residential trip, students will take part in 9 different activities including obstacle courses, high ropes and many, many more!

First Aid:


Bags should also be plain black.


Remembrance Day Memorial Service

We would like to invite all parents and carers to our memorial service for Remembrance Day on **Thursday 11**th **November 2021**


All are welcome to attend, but please keep in mind that this is an **outside service** held on the playground. It will begin at 10:40am and will finish at approximately 11:05am.
