Why is reading important?

"Reading is the master skill of secondary school. Skilled reading, writing and talking is crucial for our students to succeed."



We all know that reading is important.

But did you know that **Children** who are weak readers will

struggle as much in mathematics and science at GCSE as they do in English and in arts subjects? While there is a connection between reading ability and success in all GCSE subjects, the link between good reading and good grades is actually higher in mathematics than in some arts subjects like English literature and history.

Did you know that girls are better than boys at reading? A quarter of all 15-year-old boys have a reading age of 12 or below, and the reading ability gap between boys and girls widens significantly after primary school.

We take reading very seriously at Becket Keys. Recently, Mrs Knowles has been leading 'reading across the curriculum',

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Great news for the school basketball teams who played this week.

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where students of all ages and abilities have been exposed to academic wider reading in all subjects on a weekly basis. We test students annually to assess their reading age. This helps us to identify students who need more support; both in intervention workshops and within lessons. Across the curriculum, teachers are trained in how to teach reading; demonstrating reading strategies and modelling the thinking process of reading whenever they read a text with students. We focus on key vocabulary for each unit of work and encourage students to use subject specific words in class.

The more you can support at home to encourage reading for pleasure, the better. Giving children time away from electronic devices, setting quiet time aside for reading, leading by example and reading with them, exploring the type of genre and author they enjoy reading and asking questions about their reading will all help. 



Summer Opportunities



Applications are now open for the Lucy Cavendish College Summer Preparation Programme 2022!

The Summer Preparation Programme is designed to bridge the gap between GCSE (National 5/equivalent) and A-Level study by providing students with a monthlong programme of academic enrichment tailored to their stage of the curriculum. The programme will consist of study skills workshops on a range of important themes such as time management and essay writing, university readiness sessions to support Year 11 students as they plan their next steps to top Universities like Cambridge, and substantive knowledge sessions, designed to supplement students' foundational academic knowledge so that they can hit the ground running when they start their post-16 studies.

The Summer Preparation
Programme 2022 will build on the success of last year's pilot programme, following which 96% of students felt more confident about starting their post-16 studies:

 "[The Summer Preparation Programme] helped me fill in any gaps from GCSE, as well as bridge the gap for A-Levels. The presentations really inspired me and gave me a huge boost of motivation and excitement for sixth form, deepening



my interest in my field as well as helping me understand how I can excel in my studies and further explore my interests outside of the school syllabus."

 exams. I feel like the advice
 given will stay with me for a

The programme will take place entirely **online** and will run over

the summer holidays for four weeks, from Monday 8th August to Wednesday 31st August.
Following the Summer Preparation Programme, all students will be invited to participate in the Academic Enrichment Programme 2022/23, which will provide continuous academic support to students throughout Year 12). We
