School Run

Please do not drive into Sawyers Hall Lane! I am sure a few of you have made that decision for yourselves already, but in case any of you are still driving in, please refrain from doing so. The road is dangerous and busy outside the school. Please drop your children off elsewhere and ask them to walk the last bit. Similarly, when picking up, perhaps ask them to walk to a local car park (Brentwood Centre or Sainsbury's) or Doddinghurst Road or Shenfield Road where there are plenty of places to park with no restrictions.

Meet Some New Staff



Mrs Dowsett SENCo/Assistant Headteacher

I am excited to be joining Becket Keys as an Assistant Headteacher and as the SENCo (Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator). I was born in Essex and I have previously taught in Hillingdon, Newham and most recently in Thurrock. Over the summer holiday I got married so I will be getting used to my new surname.

In my last job I taught History and Politics from Year 7 to Year 13. It was a great time to be teaching Politics with all the changes to government and leadership. As a Year 12 and 13 tutor I enjoyed helping students with their applications to university. I worked in the SEN office and my role was to co-ordinate best practice from teachers and leaders to the whole school community. From January 2020 I studied for my NASENCo award

which was a challenging experience during the pandemic.

As SENCo at Becket Keys my role is to direct and lead support for students who have a disability or a learning need. It is a very important role to ensure that all students have equal access to education and opportunities. I will be working with school leaders, teachers, support staff and Learning Support Technicians (LSTs) to provide the best educational experience. Every teacher is a teacher of Special Educational Needs. As well as my qualifications and teaching experience I have personal experience of SEN as my brother is Autistic. When I visited Becket Keys, I was happy to see so much love and understanding from students and staff, which is a vital ingredient when working in SEN.

Outside of school I attend a weekly 5k Park Run at my local park. I've managed to clock up 50 runs and gain my red 50 runs tshirt. I also enjoy swimming and reading. I find cooking very relaxing and enjoy exploring new dishes to cook. My family are very important to me and I spend a lot of time with my two younger brothers. As a historian I love an exhibition and am a member of the British Museum and English Heritage, helping me visit lots of historic sites! I have 4 pet chickens in the garden who are named after female political leaders (come and find me if you'd like to know which ones!)







Despite the challenges posed by the COVID pandemic and a national drop in top grades, we have seen more students getting As and A*s and more students getting into their first-choice university than ever before. GCSE Results

Becket Keys Church of England School celebrated another set of excellent GCSE results. Students in the 2022 cohort have achieved the highest results the school has ever seen with more students entering the Ebacc and passing it strongly than ever before.

There are a number of individual success stories that result from notably high performance. One in five students in the school gained at least one of the most prestigious Grade 9s. This "rare grade" demonstrates performance above that of the old A*.

Our top performing students were Rebecca Lyle with nine Grade 9s and Anna Uings with eight Grade 9s. Both are looking forward to staying at Becket Keys for Sixth Form. Rebecca will study Maths, Further Maths, Mandarin and Chemistry and Anna is studying Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics and Geography.



Sitting quietly by a small body of water in a woodland, I was blessed with the opportunity to watch dragonflies; the early morning sunlight catching their transparent colourless wings and transforming them into something of great beauty. I have heard this likened to the transforming Light of God in our lives. Despite their short life cycle, they carry a message of hope and the wisdom of transformation as well as adaptability for the people of God's ever-changing world. Matthew 5:14-16 states:

'You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and hide it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on a stand so that the light can shine and illuminate

everyone. In the same way, let your light shine upon people. Let them see and praise your good deeds. You in turn, praise the Father in heaven.'

Hence, dragonflies also can remind us to keep our sights upon God.

Dragonflies have flown the earth for around 300 million years, long before dinosaurs walked the earth! Back then, due to higher oxygen levels, they had the wingspan of eagles! My research shows the diversity of spiritual meanings that has been attributed to them, from prosperity, determination, self-realisation and courage to peace, harmony and purity. Over the years, the symbolism of the dragonfly has also given comfort to those who grieve.

We continue to hold the Royal Family and all those who grieve in our prayers. 'The story of the dragonfly', whilst written for children, has a soft and reassuring message for us all:



Once, in a little pond, in the muddy water under the lily pads, there lived a little water beetle in a community of water beetles. They lived a simple and comfortable life in the pond.

Once in a while, sadness would come to the community when one of their fellow beetles would climb the stem of a lily pad and would never be seen again. They knew when this happened; their friend was dead, gone forever. Then, one day, one little water beetle felt an irresistible urge to climb up that stem. However, he was determined that he would not leave forever. He would come back and tell his friends what he had found at the top. When he reached the top and climbed out of the water onto the surface of

the lily pad, he was so tired, and the sun felt so warm, that he decided he must take a nap.

As he slept, his body changed and when he woke up, he had turned into a beautiful blue-tailed dragonfly with broad wings and a slender body designed for flying. So, fly he did! And, as he soared, he saw the beauty of a whole new world and a far superior way of life to what he had never known existed. Then he remembered his beetle friends and how they were thinking by now he was dead. He wanted to go back to tell them and explain to them that he was now more alive than he had ever been before

His life had been fulfilled rather than ended. But his new body would not go down into the water. He could not get back to tell his friends the good news. Then he understood that their time would come, when they too, would know what he now knew. So, he raised his wings and flew off into his joyous new life".



Let us pray:






