Mr Scott-Evans writes:

Shoes!

2 Corinthians 9:6-8

Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work.

This week, as part of our widening personal development programme, I have been delivering assemblies to students in Years 7,8,9 and 10 about a local charity run a Christian couple: Gary and Penny Seithel. Gary and Penny have been friends of mine for many years and have been visiting Uganda as part of their missionary work.

A few years ago, Penny noticed in Uganda that women and girls were often walking around without shoes on. She discovered that in such an impoverished society that when tough choices were made about who would go to school and who would have shoes that boys and men were prioritised.

Deeply affected by this Penny and Gary purchased ten pairs of shoes for ten girls. They then asked God for help in thinking of a way to support in this situation.

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charity called 'I Got Shoes' and began looking for local partners to support them in assisting with shoes for girls in Uganda.

Shoes are closely linked to school access in Uganda. Effectively, in many villages, if you do not have shoes you are not allowed to access schooling. Thus, many girls have to leave school at an early age and will be set to work or to marriage as young as 13 years of age.

This has deeply affected Penny and Gary and through their small charity they have established that for only £70 they can keep children, with girls as a priority, in primary school. For £70, they can provide shoes, uniform and all school fees. The schools will also provide a hot meal every day for this money.



Our school's charity committee met before Christmas and decided to support 'I Got Shoes' as one of the two chosen charities for this year. This means that half of the money from the nonuniform day will go to this worthy



cause. The money raised will ensure that another five girls are able to attend school for a year.

I Got Shoes have now secured school places for over 500 children. However, secondary places are more expensive and harder to achieve. I Got Shoes is looking to us as a school to work with them to help. They currently have 17 senior students, 12 being girls!

We will be raising money this year to make a difference to this important work. One of the things that is most exciting about the project is that there are absolutely no administration costs. Every single penny that is raised will go to the work in Uganda. Penny and Gary are not earning anything from this and are doing all the work voluntarily.

I would be very grateful if you would speak to your son/daughter about what they thought of the collective worship times this week. If you want to look at the website together it is here: igotshoes.co.uk. The students took home bookmarks

with more details on and a <u>Facebook</u> and <u>Instagram</u> profile to look for.

We pray that we will be able to help these children in Uganda with our financial and prayerful support this year. If you feel moved to give, please do so via the I Got Shoes website. I am also hopeful that as part of our wider development programme some time spent thinking of how wealthy we are during a period of relative financial hardship will do all of our students good.

Sixth Former for Day


Monday 9th January saw the occasion of Sixth Former for a Day event – and this year it was bigger and better than ever as word of our excellent Sixth Form continues to spread!



Nearly 250 Year 11 students, including over 120 from other schools, experienced a day of Key Stage 5 lessons to help them gain an insight into what they can expect at Becket Keys next year. They also had the chance to become familiar with important parts of the Sixth Form programme as they attended a Collective Worship and tutorial period. Both of these are central to keeping the students bonded as a tightly knit community in which there is plenty of support (and laughs) for each other.



With the main objective of the day being to help the students make decisions on subjects they



were not sure about taking, there were plenty of opportunities to gain this knowledge and ask interesting questions.

So far, we have had well over 300 applications from students who are interested in joining our Sixth Form next year, including nearly 200 from students who currently go to other schools. Interviews will commence shortly (information will be emailed home soon).

All students who are interviewed will be offered a place in the Sixth Form and invited to our compulsory Bridging Event (Tuesday 20th and Wednesday 21st June). There will also be other occasions that prospective Sixth Form students will be able to join in activities in order to prepare for their time in Years 12 and 13 at

Becket Keys. Please keep an eye out for notices about these.

into practice. The students also encountered many different animals. The campus Starbucks also proved popular!




There were plenty of opportunities to gain knowledge and ask questions - the students were interested in the entry requirements and apprenticeships on offer.

Year 11 students are now welcome to apply for the annual Emmanuel College Student Union's Shadowing Scheme 2023. Students must identify as from a racial or ethnic minority in the UK to apply and take part.

This free online scheme aims to provide participants with the opportunity to discover new subjects through subject streams: Humanities, Humanities & Social Sciences, Biological & Medical Sciences, and Physical & Mathematical Sciences.

Each 'stream' will involve students watching specially recorded lectures on a range of topics, following which they will complete small written tasks and receive feedback in supervisionstyle sessions, all of which is designed and led by Cambridge academics. Students will also meet current undergraduate students through virtual mentoring sessions and learn about university and student life in general during weekly social sessions.

The programme will run across four weeks beginning from the 27th February and finishing by 24th March. There will be two academic and/or social sessions a week via Zoom. Students will also be invited to visit Emmanuel for a Celebration Day upon completing the Shadowing Scheme (date and time to be confirmed during the scheme).

Applications are open to Year 11 students who are from a racial or ethnic minority background. However, numbers will be limited and students who also meet one or more of the following eligibility criteria will be prioritised:

Attend UK state school.

Eligible for (or has been eligible for in the past 6 years) Free School Meals.

Experience of being in care or a young carer.

First generation (would be the first in their family to attend Higher Education)

The deadline for Year 11s to apply is 23:59 on WEDNESDAY 8TH FEBRUARY

Mr Scott-Evans recently wrote to all families to see if you would like to donate any books to Becket Keys Church of England School. Many thanks to those who have already contributed.



YOUTH SERVICE Inspire Enable Achieve

The Young Essex Assembly (YEA) is the elected youth council for Essex and is supported by Essex Youth Service.

Every two years, 75 young people representing all districts across Essex are elected on to the YEA where they review priorities, consult organisations and decision makers to ensure young people are a key part of discussions and decisions made at all levels.

The Young Essex Assembly encourages young people to become active members of their local and wider community and enables them to influence change.

The members of the Young Essex Assembly meet once every month, they call these meetings 'sittings'. Members will also be a part of an area group working on local issues. Each member is asked to take part in another group, which focuses on current work the YEA is undertaking. These are called 'Sub-Groups'.

All sittings are held within the County and will often take place on a Saturday or on a day during the school holidays. Smaller

Requirements

This is the level of requirements for YEA members:

- The minimum age to join the YEA is 11 years and attending secondary school.
- The maximum age to join the YEA is 19 years, or up to 25 years if you have additional needs.
- You must either live, work or study in the district you wish to represent.
- You will be expected to attend a monthly meeting in Chelmsford, which we call a Sitting, plus a monthly Local Link meeting in your local area.

meetings, which involve the subgroups, usually take place during an evening mid-week.

There are 75 YEA members, representing all districts across Essex. The Young Essex Assembly review priorities and consult with young people as well as campaigning to make a positive difference for young people in Essex.

Elections will be held in Summer 2023 with applications being welcomed from 1st July 2022 and the deadline will be Friday 20th January 2023.





The calendar of the Christian Church now returns to what is sometimes referred to as 'Ordinary Time'. After all the festivities and celebrating the baptism of Jesus, this sounds


In the last few months, the need for the Foodbank has increased by more than 50% and the local Food Bank is now currently feeding over 100 people every day.

JANUARY ITEMS REQUIRED




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Sports News

The game was tactically well played with fast feeds into the circle. Our target was to reduce "rushed mistakes" and in the final quarter not one was made!


The opposition voted Lexie as their player of the match, this is the second time in a row, and a recognition of her hard work and dedication to the game.
