GCSE Awards Evening

Proverbs 16v3 Commit your work to the Lord, and your plans will be established.

Last night we celebrated with our Year 11 cohort from 2022 at our Annual GCSE Awards Evening. Students were presented with their exam certificates and their **RET Ebacc Certificates. This** group of students were our highest performing yet, both in terms of progress and attainment. The students also exemplify the values the school aspires to. They went through the whole Covid lockdown situation and put up with months of remote learning only to then find that when it came to their exams unlike the previous two cohorts they would be sitting the GCSE exams with very few

amendments and adjustments to help them.

Minimal changes were made, and minimal grade adjustments were offered. They really were a cohort who were dealt a poor hand. However, despite all these challenges, in line with our vision to be 'fruitful' (John 15v16-17) these students took responsibility for their own learning. We are incredibly proud of them all.

One story continues to stand out for me and that is of Lucy O'Hare who denied herself her mobile phone for months to prioritise her exams. She reaped the benefits of that discipline with four Grade 9s and six Grade 8s. This week, Lucy spoke to the current Year 11s to offer some advice about what they could be doing to excel as she did. She is an example to us all.

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

However, Lucy was not the highest performing student.



Rebecca Lyle gained ten grade 9s making her one of the top performing students in the whole country.



Luca Lombard made more progress than any other student. He not only exceeded his targets in every subject, but he also achieved, on average, three grades above target across every subject that he sat. In English Language, he gained a Grade 8 which was 4 grades above his target! Luca also gained four Grade 7s and four Grade 6s.

Our GCSE awards evening rightly celebrated such outstanding

individual performance. However, it also recognised the achievement of the whole cohort. From various starting points and to various levels of attainment, as I already said, this was the best cohort we have ever had. The Progress 8 score for this cohort was 0.34 which basically means that the average student here made 0.34 of a grade above target across 8 of their GCSEs. The national figure is -0.03; students nationally just scrape in below their target. Sadly, the Essex figure is -0.21 which means that students are underperforming across our county. However, here students are 0.55 ahead of the average student in Essex. That takes significant hard work and everyone should be proud of what we are doing here.

Our Ebacc achievement was also the best that it has ever been. This year, 78 students gained this prestigious level of performance and picked up a special RET certificate to recognise their level of commitment to the most important and challenging subjects in school. This will continue to go up and up as more and more students now sit a language as a GCSE.

As you can tell, I am incredibly proud of this group, and I was on a real high last night celebrating with them! Miss Brown gave a tremendous speech about some of her memories and had created a video of clips and photos from over the years. A few tissues were needed as she read a beautiful poem that she had adapted for

the evening. Her message was clear: we care about the grades, we care about what students go on to do, but what we really care about is a student's Christian character and faith. Our final two awards were given with this in mind: Lucy Gunn and Calum Hayes had been chosen by staff for their constant representation of what the school stands for. Two very worthy winners from a year group where there were many more who could also have won.



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












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Mandarin Day 2023

At lunch, students watched a sensational traditional Chinese lion dance and enjoyed some Chinese food that Bistro served. They also received a souvenir for the day.






The day offered our students the opportunity to look beyond Chinese as merely a language and gain a deeper understanding of Chinese culture. It has been wonderful to see so many happy faces.

What we're looking for: We'd like you to research, write and create a short (8-12 minute) lecture on a topic of your choice.

Your lecture should be a 'talking head' style, like all the lectures on MASSOLIT, though you should feel free to make use of props (e.g. quoting from a book, playing some music, demonstrating a concept with props, etc.) if you feel it adds to your explanation.



Then again, if your lecture doesn't include any props, that's also fine!

Entries will be judged on:

Creativity

The educational value of the lecture – does the viewer learn something interesting and unexpected?


The clarity and concision of the script – is the material structured in a logical way?




Ms. Stone & Mrs Walker recommend...

Year 11 students are now welcome to apply for the annual Emmanuel College Student Union's Shadowing Scheme 2023. Students must identify as from a racial or ethnic minority in the UK to apply and take part.

This free online scheme aims to provide participants with the opportunity to discover new subjects through subject streams: Humanities, Humanities & Social Sciences, Biological & Medical Sciences, and Physical & Mathematical Sciences.

Each 'stream' will involve students watching specially recorded lectures on a range of topics, following which they will complete small written tasks and receive feedback in supervisionstyle sessions, all of which is designed and led by Cambridge academics. Students will also meet current undergraduate students through virtual mentoring sessions and learn about university and student life in general during weekly social sessions.

The programme will run across four weeks beginning from the 27th February and finishing by 24th March. There will be two academic and/or social sessions a week via Zoom. Students will also be invited to visit Emmanuel for a Celebration Day upon completing the Shadowing Scheme (date and time to be confirmed during the scheme).

Applications are open to Year 11 students who are from a racial or ethnic minority background. However, numbers will be limited and students who also meet one or more of the following eligibility criteria will be prioritised:

Attend UK state school.

Eligible for (or has been eligible for in the past 6 years) Free School Meals.

Experience of being in care or a young carer.

First generation (would be the first in their family to attend Higher Education)

The deadline for Year 11s to apply is 23:59 on WEDNESDAY 8TH FEBRUARY



expect God to bless the things we do when we operate according to His ways in dependence upon Him. However, this does not mean we will always find things easy, whether preparing for examinations or being successful in an interview. Instead, we can expect God to fulfil His promise of Romans 8:28, "We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose."

This proverb is similar in context to Psalm 1:1-3

'Blessed is the person who does not follow the advice of wicked people, take the path of sinners, or join the company of mockers. Rather, he delights in the teachings of the Lord and reflects on his teachings day and night.

He is like a tree planted beside streams—
a tree that produces fruit in season
and whose leaves do not wither.
He succeeds in everything he does.'

When we commit our ways and our work to the Lord, He will bless our efforts according to His perfect will in ways beyond our understanding. We should serve the Lord faithfully and then leave the results to Him. Though we will still face times of difficulty, we can trust that God is working for His ultimate good, and ours, through our efforts to please Him in our daily lives.

How can we commit our ways and our work to the Lord? Below are seven key ideas to apply every day, so that you can be a witness for God and receive His blessing: Start working enthusiastically

Understand who you really work for

Concentrate on building your character

Care about the people you work with

Exceed what is expected of you

Expand Your Skills to SUCCEED

Dedicate your work to be used for God's purposes
