Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

As we approach the Lent Holiday, I find myself reflecting on the intersection of tradition, faith, and modernity. Our school community at Becket Keys has always embraced the rich heritage of our Christian values while also adapting to the changing world around us. Today, I want to share some thoughts about a topic that has been making waves in the educational landscape: Artificial Intelligence (AI)

AI: A Blessing and a Challenge




## Book of the Month -February
