I am writing today to share some important news and also to express our deepest gratitude to a remarkable individual who has been instrumental in the success of Becket Keys Church of England School. Our Chair of Governors, Jenny Downs, will be stepping down at the end of this summer term. Jenny has been a cornerstone of our school community, and her contributions are very difficult to summarise.

Jenny was part of the founding group, sharing the original vision for the school with me when the campaign first began in 2010. While our timeline did not allow for her eldest daughter, Ruby, to attend, her son Gabriel and her other two daughters, Ester and Tilly, have been proud students at

Becket Keys. Ester is Deputy
Head Girl and will be the last of
the family to leave this summer.
Her husband Steve has also been
a loyal supporter and friend of the
school throughout the last
decade and a half!

Jenny's tireless support has been pivotal. She has been involved in appointing many of the staff members you know today, ensuring that our school is staffed with dedicated and talented individuals. Her advocacy for safe travel in Sawyers Hall Lane led to significant improvements, including path widening, new road markings, and an upcoming raised table to slow traffic and enhance safety.

Over the years, Jenny must have chaired over a hundred meetings, and she has participated in every


FINAL CHECKS MAKE UP & HAIR ACADEMY




Queen of crime Holly Jackson returns with a blisteringly good standalone thriller!

Sports News

With the newly created Brentwood district being formed after the split from Mid-Essex it provided a whole new challenge for our athletes. Becket Keys was represented by 5 of our athletes selected to represent and wear the new Brentwood vest.

The first athlete we had competing was Mathew Delea in the 800m. Matty ran a personal best and met national standard with a 2:03 time securing a silver medal.



Our second athlete was Year 8 power thrower Tiana Abrahams who competed against girls who were a year older. She managed to throw a respectable 18m falling just shy of the podium but next year she'll have eyes on medals.

Thirdly was the banker, Max Sanderson who is 5th fastest in the United Kingdom for his age. Max ran the 3000m and won comfortably and was only lightly pushed by his Brentwood Beagles teammate.

Romilie Deal showed courage in the hurdles, like Tiana, she was competing up a year group against Year 11 girls. This year was tough but next year we hope Rom can also be standing on the podium!

Finally, Evie Warn represented in the 1500 steeple chase. After spending the previous 6-8 weeks in a boot with an ankle injury it was touch and go whether she would be able compete. Thankfully, she felt fit enough to run and she certainly made sure to keep the day exciting as she took the second water jump hesitantly and the rolled her bad ankle! The wincing looks on her face as each steeple caused great discomfort showed just how much of a warrior our little Evie is! She managed to fight off third in a sprint finish to hold on to second place!

I personally couldn't be happier for our athletes and even those who we selected to trial for the day. This event is simply for the best of the best in Essex and for 3 athletes to reach the podium and 2 competing up a year it shows what talented performers we have!

This Essex Championship medal was not enough for Max Sanderson who had another 3000m the very next day in Windsor at the Thames Valley athletics centre! Speaking with Max after this event, he has his heart set on representing Becket Keys at future meets to showcase where his hunger and desire all started.


GROUNDSKEEPER required by the Sports

Lane, Brentwood, Essex.


To maintain the high standards shared by the School and the Sports Trust there is a requirement for a grounds person to carry out weekly maintenance on the Astroturf pitch and surrounding area.

The Astroturf is going to be re-laid this summer so future regular maintenance is essential.

These duties will include: -

- 1) Weekly brushing using the onsite machinery
- 2) Site maintenance and upkeep, including weed clearing and removing debris
- 3) Site safety checks
- 4) Minor repairs and upkeep of facilities when required

We opened the batting with Elizabeth Thompson and Katie Todd who began peppering the boundaries! Captain Erin Delea soon came in and in similar fashion started racking up the runs. Bella Sanderson came in at the fall of Elizabeth and the Erin/Bella partnership saw out the batting to accumulate a healthy 93 runs! Grays were unable to chase this down and we won game 1 by a convincing 33 runs.

Game 2 we started off exactly the same, however, Katie was able to remain in for longer and the Elizabeth/Katie partnership flourished. Between them they partnered a 50 and then 75! Katie then fell and Erin came in. Maddie was over the moon as she came in to see out the St Martin's deliveries and she and Elizabeth, the opener, walked back with a staggering 105. Next year we will enter the nationals because on another day we would have won this game.






Girls' Football
