We are all called to be Saints

Next week we will be continuing to celebrate our Patronal Saints: St. Peter and St. Thomas à Becket. Both Saints are Bishops. St. Peter – the first Bishop, the rock on whom Christ would build his church and the Saint to whom the 'Keys to the Kingdom of Heaven' were given (hence the keys on our badge). St. Thomas à Becket was Archbishop of Canterbury from 1162 to his murder in 1170. Hence 'Becket' in our name and the Bishop's Mitre on our badge.

Together, from these two Saints, we take our name: Becket Keys.

Both Saints have festivals at this time of year. Both of our closest parish churches: St. Thomas and St. Peter are celebrating! We have been, and will continue to be, joining in with several activities.

We have already enjoyed a Patronal Festival concert at St Peter's Church where our choirs and orchestras joined forces with those from St Peter's Primary school to entertain a lively audience (who seemed rather joyful to be missing another turgid England football performance). Yesterday, was our Governors' Speech and Awards Evening, and it was supposed to be Sports Day today (postponed until Thursday 18th July). 

Governors Speech & Awards Evening 2024



We celebrated the achievements of some Becket Keys students at the Governors' Speech & Awards Evening last night. We were delighted to be joined by Penny and Gary Seithel, the founders of 'I Got 'Shoes' one of the charities the school is currently supporting and hear about their work supporting young people in Uganda. We were also joined by Stefan Tkaczyk, the incoming president of the Rotary Club á Becket and our governors Mrs Chris Savage and Fr Andrew Grey who presented special awards. Patrick Warriner one of our former students was in attendance to present the Warriner Cup. Students received awards for subjects, sporting achievements and character and conduct.





Election Day at Becket Keys!

On July 4th 2024 the country went to polling stations in 650 constituencies across the country. At the same time, Becket Keys also held our own mock election. A polling station was set up in the Chapel and students and staff were given the chance to vote for their favoured political party. The results can be seen below.

As you may have seen, locally, Alex Burghart has retained his Brentwood seat with Reform UK coming second and Labour third. Nationally the Labour party will form the next government winning a significant majority, of 412 seats in the House of Commons The turnout nationally is down 7% on 2019, to 60%. Everyone is encouraged to watch the news later in order to analyse the results in full.

Thank you to all those students who took the time to vote and participated in democracy. I should also like to thank the Year 12 Politics class who administered the election. In particular I would like to thank Gilulia, Pearl, Katelyn, Mikaela, Unnati and Naima who have all given their time this week in helping to deliver collective worship to



students. I should also like to thank Thomas Baker who proved the most capable deputy on polling day.




Remember that drinks are available for purchase from the Bistro at break and lunch.

Year 9 Boys' Cricket


