BACK TO SCHOOL!

Mr Scott-Evans writes.....

Back to school!

It has been a busy summer at Becket Keys with four major projects being started. We have completed one of them which was the rewiring of the school IT infrastructure. Al the cables and cabinets and Wi-Fi boxes have been replaced to speed up and supercharge our signals. This will make teaching and learning faster and slicker and help us keep up with the latest developments in technology. This project has cost over £200,000.

If you have been to the site over the summer, you will have noticed that the astro turf has also been replaced. This project started late, but finished on time and we now have a beautiful new surface thanks to our partnership with the sports trust. This has also cost around £160,000. Dr Hurdle has advised students that the new surface is very precious and in exceptional condition and thus we will only allow students to go on it if they are wearing training shoes.

Similarly, anyone even driving past will have seen the scaffolding and people on the roofs. All the flat roofs on Carey and Williams are being replaced. Fortunately, this project is running smoothly, to time and to cost (around half a million pounds). We expect the workers to be on site for a couple more months so access around the site is slightly reduced. Students will need to be patient and responsible as they move around to lessons and breaks.

Finally, we have also begun the replacement of the student toilets in Carey. At the moment, we are having to use Portakabin toilets (which are very nice indeed – see photo).



We are in the process of designing the new arrangement which will include private individual cubicles with floor to ceiling doors and walls for separate sex facilities and a shared open space for handwashing. We expect these new toilets to be ready after the All Saints' Holiday in October. The cost of this work will be around £225,000.

In a time when school budgets are squeezed to such an extent, we are pleased to be receiving a lot of funding from RET for these projects. However, I would urge parents to be generous when we ask for donations on ParentPay. Running a school is a very expensive business and we

cannot expect to continue to have such amazing facilities and staff without your support.

It is not hard to walk around the school and see other things that we would like to have or to replace, with your support we can maintain the high standards we have all come to expect and enjoy.

Each term we ask for a voluntary contribution from parents towards the running of the school. A letter about this will come out later in the term. However, if you are inspired and want to give something today – it is open on Parent-Pay with a suggested donation of £36. Please give more if you can!

Excellent GCSE & Ebacc Results

Becket Keys Church of England School celebrated another set of excellent GCSE results. Students in the 2024 cohort have achieved the highest results the school has ever seen with more students than ever before achieving Grades 4-9 in both English and Mathematics. In addition, a record number of students were entered for and passed the Ebacc. The average point score for students sitting the Ebacc is the highest the school has ever achieved!



Two of our top performing students were Ruth Pennant with ten Grade 9s, and Elizabeth Thompson with nine Grade 9s, one Grade 8.

Ruth will be staying at Becket Keys to study Spanish, History and Mathematics.

Elizabeth will be staying at Becket Keys to study Psychology, Chemistry, Mathematics and Biology.

Max Sanderson achieved the highest progress of any student in the school. Max achieved two Grade 9s, two Grade 8s, two Grade 7s and three Grade 6s. Max will be staying at Becket Keys to study Psychology, History and PE.

World Challenge 2024



Becket Keys have been working with World Challenge since 2017. World Challenge is an organization that offers unique and inspiring experiences for schools through various programmes. Here are some key aspects of World Challenge:

- 1. Leadership Expeditions: These expeditions are student-led and focus on developing leadership skills.
- 2. Learning Service Journeys: These journeys are designed to foster global citizenship through cultural immersion. Students spend 7–13 nights in different countries, expanding their minds by sharing cultures and stepping out of their comfort zones.
- 3. Project Independence: For those who want to take the road less travelled, Project Independence offers independent trips with like-minded friends. It's an adventure of a lifetime for brave students.

The 2024 expedition to Borneo was an amazing adventure students visited a Orangutan rehabilitation centre, trekked through the rain forest, and learned to pitch a hammock and sleep under the stars.





The following is a reflection written by Joshua Witchalls (Year 11).

World challenge chucked me in the deep end so many times, putting me in situations I never thought I'd be in, and have never had to think about – like securing and sterilising water for the group. I've been in positions and places that I never could have dealt with a few years ago.

Everything was a challenge, but nothing was too challenging – it all felt achievable and within our grasp. There were problems that we were able to disregard and ignore, going beyond our comfort

zones, helping us learn to appreciate every small bonus.

I've learned that enjoying something is a choice, and enjoying something doesn't mean that everything goes according to plan. We've learned to deal with situations we're unfamiliar with and adapt to changing situations — staying together as a team no matter what.

Most importantly, I've grown in my faith and grown in both appreciation and reliance on God. As Isaiah writes, "the people in darkness have seen a great light" – I have had the pleasure of being pushed increasingly into that light over this trip.

School Run

Please do not drive into Sawyers Hall Lane! I am sure a few of you have made that decision for yourselves already, but in case any of you are still driving in, please refrain from doing so. The road is dangerous and busy outside the school. Please drop your children off elsewhere and ask them to walk the last bit. Similarly, when picking up, perhaps ask them to walk to a local car park (Brentwood Centre or Sainsbury's) or Doddinghurst Road or Shenfield Road where there are plenty of places to park with no restrictions.

Encouraged by the example of Peter, Thomas of Canterbury and all your saints, may its students know the beauty of your truth;


May its staff know the joy of your service;
