- Pension Guarantee Credit

- Support under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act, 1999
- Working Tax Credit run-on, paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit, with a household income of £7,400 or less (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Many students were keen to learn how their library card is not just for borrowing books but allows them to access a range of great resources online from their own homes. These resources will be invaluable for students when completing homework.

Students have been begging to return and many students have navigated their way back to Brentwood library after school to swap their books for something else.

On Friday, 22nd November, sixty of our Year 10 students had the incredible opportunity to participate in the Jack Petchey Speak Out Workshop. This event, designed to empower young people and enhance their public speaking skills, was a resounding success and will undoubtedly leave a lasting impact on all who attended.

The workshop, part of the prestigious Jack Petchey Foundation's initiatives, focused on building confidence, improving communication skills, and encouraging self-expression. Throughout the day, students engaged in a variety of activities and exercises aimed at honing their ability to speak confidently in front of an audience.

One of the highlights of the day was the chance for students to deliver their own speeches.
Guided by experienced trainers, they learned valuable techniques for structuring their talks, using body language effectively, and engaging their listeners. The supportive environment allowed everyone to step out of their comfort zones and discover their potential as public speakers.





Feedback from the participants was overwhelmingly positive. Many students expressed how the workshop helped them overcome their fear of public speaking and gave them tools they can use in their academic and personal lives. One student remarked, "I never thought I

could speak in front of so many people, but the workshop gave me the confidence to do it. It was an amazing experience!"

Of the sixty students who took part, the workshop leaders chose 6 students who will perform their speech in a collective worship. There will be a panel of teacher judges who will choose an overall Becket Key's winner to represent the school in the regional finals of the Jack Petchey Speak Out challenge! These 6 students are: Kaylin Nachwa Muwenda (10HS), Noah Lynch (10EW), Mia Walters (10HS), Oscar Gibb (10FS), Eloise Knowles (10PP) and Maria Shipperlee (10HS)- A massive congratulations to all of you and good luck on the next stage of the challenge!

Visiting Students from China

We have an opportunity for students across the school to be an in-school host 'buddy' to a Chinese student in January 2025.

We have twenty students and two accompanying teachers coming from China for a period of five school days between January 20th and January 24th. Each day the students will be with us for the majority of the school day and host students will buddy up with a Chinese student of a similar age for the majority of the week.

This will involve taking the Chinese student along to all lessons, break times, lunch times and clubs to give them an immersion experience into an English School week. The idea is to give them a huge amount of English speaking and listening practice but also to give them an insight into what schooling is like in the UK.

The school will also put on a welcoming assembly at the beginning of the week and a special afternoon on the final day with some games and a ceremony of presenting certificates to the Chinese students. There may be one or two other events that will involve Becket Keys students missing a few lessons.



There will be some photos taken by the Chinese students and staff as evidence of their visit and for good memories. Our students will also be able to take photos at these set times and perhaps even record a little video if all involved are willing. Sometimes students keep in touch with their host buddies depending on willingness from both sides to do this. There is no expectation or insistence.

This opportunity particularly suits those students who are studying Chinese Mandarin, but it is not limited to these students. All are welcome to host a student.

If there are more volunteers than students available, Mr Scott-Evans will make the final decision of whom to choose.


