### The Power of Forgiveness

At Becket Keys, we teach that forgiveness is a powerful and transformative act that can bring peace and healing to our lives. It is one of our key values. Father Mark, came to speak to Year 7 today about this very thing. He told us that as we navigate through our daily challenges at school and elsewhere, it's important to remember the unending forgiveness that God offers us.

In the words of Psalm 86, we are reminded to rejoice in God's mercy, His readiness to forgive and His unfailing love:

"O Lord, you are so good, so ready to forgive, so full of unfailing love for all who ask for your help. Listen closely to my prayer, O Lord; hear my urgent cry." Psalm 86:5-6 (NLT)

These verses remind us that no matter how many times we falter, God's love and forgiveness are always available to us. This assurance can inspire us to extend the same forgiveness to others.

The Lord's Prayer also teaches us about the reciprocal nature of forgiveness:

"And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.
And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil."

Teaching students (and adults sometimes!) about forgiveness can be challenging, but we know it is a crucial step towards personal growth and spiritual well-being. By forgiving those who have wronged us, we free ourselves from the burden of resentment and open our hearts to healing and reconciliation.

As the Buddha taught "Holding on to anger is like grasping a hot coal with the intent of throwing it at someone else; you are the one who gets burned."

Matthew 6:12-15 (ESVUK) reminds us:

"For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you, but if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses."

Forgiveness is a costly, beautiful gift. It is never cheap. Theologian and apologist Amy Orr-Ewing, who acts on behalf of abuse victims around the world, says it this way:

"The abuse does hurt, it does matter, and it was wrong. It matters so much that to forgive it requires something huge: the death of the Son of God."

With the cross still ahead of him, Jesus gave his followers the invitation to forgive. He came with self-sacrificing love and



intention, and gave himself to pay for all that we owe now and all that we will owe in the future. He held nothing back at the cross and stretched out his arms in full forgiveness and love even unto death.

Reflecting on the hymn "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross," we are reminded of the ultimate sacrifice made for our forgiveness:

"When I survey the wondrous cross on which the Prince of Glory died, my richest gain I count but loss, and pour contempt on all my pride...Were the whole realm of nature mine, that were a present far too small. Love so amazing, so divine, demands my soul, my life, my all."

### Forgiveness in School Life

In our school community, forgiveness plays a vital role in maintaining harmony and fostering a supportive environment. Students often face

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situations where they need to seek forgiveness or extend it to others. Whether it's a misunderstanding with friends, a disagreement during a lesson, or a something said in the heat of the moment on line, these experiences are opportunities to practise forgiveness.

By forgiving others, we show empathy and understanding, which helps to build stronger relationships. It also teaches us to take responsibility for our actions and to learn from our mistakes. When we seek forgiveness, we demonstrate humility and a willingness to make amends, which are essential qualities for personal growth.

Forgiveness can also alleviate stress and anxiety, allowing students to focus better on their studies and extracurricular activities. It creates a positive atmosphere where everyone feels valued and respected, contributing to a more inclusive and compassionate school environment.

## Recent Events and Upcoming Opportunities

As well as speaking in Collective Worship, Father Mark also led our weekly Eucharist today which as ever included a time of repentance. Everyone is welcome every Friday at 1pm to this short service in our chapel.

Furthermore, this Sunday is Education Sunday at St Thomas' Church, and Father Mark will be leading the service. It would be wonderful to see our students and their families there. Students are encouraged to attend in their school uniforms to represent our school community.

As we reflect on these teachings, let's strive to embody the spirit of forgiveness in our daily lives. Whether it's forgiving a friend, a family member, or even ourselves, let's remember that forgiveness is a gift we give not only to others but also to ourselves.





The year's must-read young adult fantasy - ancient djinn, an epic adventure, and one girl's courage to seek her own destiny...








#### Shadow Town Richard Lambert

Toby, a lonely, unhappy boy from suburban London who finds himself pulled into an alternate world during the upheaval of his parent's impending divorce.

Toby's dad is an unkind grump, embittered by his lot in the world, and consumed by the fantasy novel he's been writing since before Toby was born. Toby's mum is a climate activist. Neither parent really pays him any attention, and his sole friends are their lodger and her cat, Alfred. Toby's miserable lot is shaken up when a shadow appears in his garden and his dreams, and he finds himself transported to a strange land, where elemental forces (blazing fires, floods and earthquakes) are at play in a kingdom ruled by a tyrant.

Lucy is the first to find the secret of the wardrobe in the professor's mysterious old house. At first her brothers and sister don't believe her when she tells of her visit to the land of Narnia. But soon Edmund, then Peter and Susan step through the wardrobe themselves. In Narnia they find a country buried under the evil enchantment of the White Witch. When they meet the Lion Aslan, they realize they've been called to a great adventure and bravely join the battle to free Narnia from the Witch's sinister spell.

Prince Caspian: The Return to Narnia


#### Shatter Me Tahereh Mafi


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#### Miss Peregrine's Home for Peculiar Children Ranson Riggs

lunchtime and there will be a special themed menu available in the Bistro and Orangery (for the usual lunch prices).



#### Book of the Month – January 2025



Tove was 12 and Liva 9, when the Germans occupied Norway. They remember everything as if it happened yesterday.

Mose and her daughter Agna are incomers in the village, treated with suspicion. But young Liva, left out of the secrets her sister Tove and brother Hakken share, idolises Agna and follows her everywhere. Unwittingly, they lead the German soldiers to a perfect island. Once a haven for picnics and story-telling under the midnight sun, it is transformed into a grim prisoner of war camp. This is an unlikely place to find buried treasure, but it's there.

There are ways to fight back, especially when Haakon joins the resistance, slipping through shadows to carry out dangerous acts of sabotage. And the girls themselves have their parts to play. Friendships are made and broken, family trust is turned upside down and lives change forever as Tove and Liva recall their childhood experiences of living through WW2 in a story that moves from light to darkness to light again.

Tense, evocative and compelling, this story of wartime resilience is inspired by the author's own family history.





## BRENTWOOD FOODBANK HELPING LOCAL PEOPLE IN CRISIS

The Brentwood foodbank is part of <u>The Trussell</u> <u>Trust's</u> network of 428 foodbanks, working to tackle food poverty and hunger in the local community, as well as across the UK.

The Foodbank Network was founded in 2004 in Salisbury, since then The Trussell Trust has helped communities work together to launch foodbanks nationwide in a wide range of towns and cities.

In 2023/24, food banks in the Trussell Trust's network provided 3,121,404 three-day emergency food supplies and support to UK people in crisis. Of these, 1,144,096 were distributed for children.







Year 11 are progressing towards the end of their course and producing their best work yet. Here is a wonderful piece by Mark. Amazing!





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
