# Resilience and celebrating families

I am so pleased to be writing to the Becket Keys family as in January I returned from maternity leave to my role as SENDCo (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Co-Ordinator). The last nine months has taught me lots about family life and I have been blessed to learn many new skills, including how to eat my dinner one-handed! I am hoping that my new skills as a parent will further enhance my role at school. During my time with my family, I was kept up to date by Mr Moyet and gladdened to hear about the fantastic progress of students and the school.

During the last term I have been reminded of the determination and resilience of Becket Keys students. As well as working extremely hard in lessons and studying at home, students have been responding to several challenges, including Year 11 and 13 mocks and Year 9 Curriculum Choices. Part of my role is to support and champion those children who are identified as SEND, or the term I prefer to use is 'neurodiverse.' Neurodiverse students face the same challenges as those students that are neurotypical, but they may have different barriers to their learning. With support from staff, the neurodiverse students at Becket Keys are amazing at identifying their own barriers, responding to them and overcoming them.

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This month I read an article about an interview with the creator of Microsoft and billionaire Bill Gates, where he spoke about his neurodiversity. On reflection, he now believes that he is on the Autistic Spectrum. He describes a childhood defined by his ability to hyperfocus on subjects he was interested in, his obsessive nature and his lack of social awareness. Gates says he hasn't had a formal diagnosis and doesn't plan to. "The positive characteristics for my career have been more beneficial than the deficits have been a problem for me," he says.



I hope and pray that the students at Becket Keys can take inspiration from Bill Gates: the challenges he was able to overcome with determination and the successes he was able to achieve with the skills that his neurodiversity brought. Finally, I would like to pray for all our families including our school family and community.






Early is on time

Parents can call the main school line o1277 286600 or use the "Studybugs" app to report genuine lateness. We thank you for your support.





The aim is to provide a focus for careers guidance activity at an important stage in the academic calendar, to help support young people develop awareness and excitement about their future pathways.




The resources and activities that are promoted during National Careers Week are available all year round so you can make use of CEIAG / Careers activities – whenever you choose to do them.



#### EVERY FIRE STARTS WITH A SINGLE SPARK

It is London,1923. Dragons soar through the skies and protests erupt on the streets, but Vivien Featherswallow isn't worried. She's going to follow the rules, get an internship studying dragon languages, and make sure her little sister never has to risk growing up Third Class.

By midnight, Viv has started a civil war.

With her parents arrested and her sister missing, all the safety Viv has worked for is collapsing around her. So when a lifeline is offered in the form of a mysterious 'job', she grabs it. Arriving at Bletchley Park, Viv discovers that she has been recruited as a codebreaker helping the war effort – if she succeeds, she and her family can all go home again. If she doesn't, they'll all die.

At first Viv believes that her challenge, of discovering the secrets of a hidden dragon language, is doable. But the more she learns, the more she realises that the bubble she's grown up in isn't as safe as she thought, and eventually Viv must decide: What war is she really fighting?

This is an epic, sweeping fantasy with a Dark Academia setting, a clandestine, slow-burn enemies-to-lovers romance, and an unputdownable story, filled with twists and turns, betrayals and secret identities,
