



MEP Tourism Project Year 10 University Visit Day Trip

On Thursday 19th June 2025, our Year 10 Mandarin Excellence Programme (MEP) students took part in an inspiring university visit hosted by Queen Mary University of London. This visit was part of the national MEP Tourism Project, a programme that begins with a two-day intensive course where students develop their Mandarin language skills alongside media and tourism-related competencies.

Following this in-school study, students worked in groups to create a campaign video promoting a UK city—entirely in Mandarin. Both the spoken content and subtitles are required to be in Mandarin, which strongly encouraged students to apply their language skills in a real-life context; boosting both confidence and fluency.

On the day of the university visit, a campaign showcase was held among the eight participating

schools, including ours, Beths
Grammar, Dartford Grammar,
Wapping High School and others.
We are incredibly proud to share that
one of our groups won the "Most
Creative Video" award — a
remarkable achievement
considering the video was selected
from over twenty shortlisted entries
across all schools.

The judges were highly impressed by the originality, presentation, and cultural awareness shown in the winning video. It was a moment of real pride for our school and a testament to the creativity, hard work, and collaboration of our Year 10 MEP students.

Congratulations to all the students involved for representing our school with such talent and enthusiasm!

Student Achievement – Thomas Baker



Thomas Baker is a Year 9 student at Becket Keys, and he takes the number 81 bus home each day as he lives close to Shenfield station.

Thomas, over the last year or so, has been very disappointed in the bus service that is offered and provided. He's been determined to get things improved and has taken it upon himself to write to the MP (twice), Brentwood council, Essex council, Brentwood bus and rail users association, the Prime Minister and the Department for Transport!

Thomas was able to provide supporting evidence that he had collected over a period of time. His concerns included the fact that the bus on this route was often overcrowded, mainly due to the face that only a single decker bus was on the route and that it was often late due to the traffic generated by the local school at the time it was due to leave.

Alex Burghart MP contacted the bus company and Mr Scott-Evans and asked a meeting to take place at school. His assistant attended along with the commercial director and operations director of NIBS bus company.

In the meeting Thomas presented some slides outlining the issues he has experienced and his ideas on how the bus company could improve things. The representatives from the bus company were very open to this and grateful to Thomas for raising these points and giving valuable feedback.

Hopefully all students using the bus to get to and from school will see an improvement in the near future!



The Foodbank Network was founded in 2004 in Salisbury, since then The Trussell Trust has helped communities work together to launch foodbanks nationwide in a wide range of towns and cities.

In 2023/24, food banks in the Trussell Trust's network provided 3,121,404 three-day emergency food supplies and support to UK people in crisis. Of these, 1,144,096 were distributed for children.

If anyone forgets a bottle or doesn't have one, they can request a second-hand bottle from Main Reception.
These bottles have been in lost property for over six weeks and are being recycled for student use. They have been thoroughly cleaned, sterilised and can be used safely. Let's reduce waste and stay refreshed!

Please note: Students are not permitted to leave lessons to fill up water bottles. Refills should be done during break or lunch times only.




