

### **Mandarin Department**

### Mandarin Exam Success

The results of this year's Mandarin HSK 3 exam (the only official Mandarin proficiency test) have been released, and we are delighted to share the achievements of our Year 10 students.

The HSK exam is an additional qualification required by the Mandarin Excellence Programme. It provides students with extra certification and recognition for their language learning.



Due to timetable constraints, last year's Year 10 group had only one hour per week (Lesson 7) to prepare for HSK, covering a large amount of vocabulary and grammar. This made the exam particularly challenging.

The year group was split into two groups: one class of 21 students taught by Miss Tian, focusing on HSK, and another smaller class of six students concentrating on GCSE Mandarin. Miss Tian, who previously taught HSK at Peking University (one of China's top universities, equivalent to Oxford or Cambridge in the UK) brought



her expertise to guide the students through this demanding course.

Out of the 21 students formally studying HSK, 11 achieved high passing scores. This marks the first time we have had such a large number of students successfully pass the HSK 3 exam. Impressively, a further six students were only a few marks away, reflecting their strong effort and dedication.

### Chinese Bridge Competition Awards Event

### What is the Chinese Bridge Competition?



The Chinese Bridge Competition is an international speaking competition for learners of Mandarin Chinese. It has two main categories, the Primary Category for students aged between 5 and 12, organised by the Centre for Language Education and Cooperation, and the Secondary Category for secondary school Mandarin students, organised by the British Council.

This year's competition was especially competitive, with many students from grammar schools and independent schools taking part. Becket Keys proudly entered three groups: Year 9 students participated in both the group and individual categories, a Year 8 student competed in the individual category, and a Year 12 team took part in the group category.

Among the strong pool of contestants, Year 9 student Isobel Nunn achieved an outstanding result, winning third



place in the individual category. A remarkable accomplishment given the high level of competition.



On Friday 26th September, Becket Keys students attended the Awards Ceremony held in London. The event welcomed UK contestants who had won either the individual or group competitions, along with their supporting teachers. Special quests presenting the awards included Zhou Wei, Minister Counsellor for Education from the Chinese Embassy, senior representatives from both the British Council and the Department for Education, as well as headteacher representatives.

The ceremony featured highlight reels from the competition, the presentation of awards and captivating performances of traditional Chinese arts. The organisers also kindly provided snacks, lunch and refreshments throughout the day.

We are also proud to share that Miss Tian and Mrs Zhang were both awarded the Best Tutor Award, in recognition of their dedication and outstanding support to the students.

There have been some exciting experiences already, too. Year 7s have enjoyed a trip to the library



# Could your child be entitled to a school meal?

### Is Your Child Eligible for Free School Meals?

Your son/daughter may be eligible for **free school meals** if **you receive any of the following benefits**:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (not Working Tax Credit), with an annual income below £16,190
- · Pension Guarantee Credit
- Employment and Support Allowance, income related
- Support under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act, 1999
- Working Tax Credit run-on, paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit, with a household income of £7,400 or less (after tax and not including any benefits you get)




### **Prayer Group**

### Previously Looked After Children



If your child has previously been in the care of a Local Authority in England or Wales and has an adoption, Special Guardianship or Child Arrangements Order, they are entitled to extra support through Pupil Premium Plus funding. Currently, the amount is £2,630 per student and it must be spent to improve outcomes for previously looked after children. It is important to note that the funding is not ring-fenced for the individual child, which allows the school flexibility to ensure it has maximum impact. As the parent or carer, you must declare your child's status and provide evidence of the legal order to us in order for us to claim the funding. You and your child are also entitled to support from our Designated Teacher (Mrs Claire Dowsett), and from the Essex Virtual School. If you wish to have a conversation about your child, we will treat the information with the strictest confidence. 
### Our School Library (Lib A)

At Becket Keys, we look to ensure that we are preparing students for life beyond school. We encourage students to attend school regularly and on time.


Remember that the school gate closes at **8.25am**. This allows students enough time to be at their first lesson on time. Period 1 begins at 8.30am.


Brentwood can be tough to negotiate during rush hour, so we encourage students and parents to contact the school in the case of *genuine* lateness, such as delayed public transport.













