Students may:


- Wear their own choice of clothes.

We look forward to all students enjoying these festive celebrations.








brilliant celebration of musicmaking in our school community.


























Soup club Monday

Why not come along? The club is open to all students.











Sixth Form Psychology & Sociology Trip

Sociology Trip to Westminster Social Science Conference

On 10th November, 30 Sociology and Psychology students had the exciting opportunity to attend a Social Science Conference in Westminster, accompanied by Mrs Walker and Ms Stone. The event brought together leading academics and researchers to share their work with sixth form students from across the country, giving our students a real insight into university-level thinking and the wider world of social science.

Throughout the day, students heard lectures covering a broad range of contemporary issues. Ellis Cashmere explored the influence of celebrity culture and how our society constructs fame. Gemma Birkett examined representations of crime, prompting students to question how the media shapes public perceptions of offenders and victims. Danny Dorling offered a thought-provoking analysis of children and poverty, encouraging students to reflect on inequality and social policy. Rachel Seoighe delivered a powerful talk on abolition, challenging us to imagine alternatives to existing systems of punishment and control. The day ended with the legendary Ann Oakley, a pioneering figure in Sociology, who discussed her experiences in research and the










importance of questioning the world around us, in relation to gender inequality.




The conference gave students a genuine taste of university-style learning and encouraged them to think beyond the classroom.

Many commented on how inspiring it was to hear directly from researchers shaping current sociological debates. It also provided valuable supercurricular enrichment, helping to support UCAS applications and deepen academic curiosity.

Our students represented the school brilliantly, participating in discussions and asking thoughtful questions throughout the day. We hope this experience continues to inspire their critical thinking and their aspirations for future study.

All tutor groups played against each other and there was a great atmosphere even though the girls were in competition.









The Year 7 teams showed their excellent passing skills and improved footwork. The fast pace of the matches meant that one team was able to score a goal in the first two minutes of a game! 7FS were a particularly high scoring team as they scored 10 goals in one match and 8 in two others!! The overall skills of all the Year 7 teams have improved since they joined the school, and the PE staff were very impressed with the teamwork shown throughout the day.

Year 8 had matches with slightly lower scores overall, however this was because the defending of the team and the marking of their opponents was at a high level. It was noted by the observers that

8WW in particular used their space well.

Excellent shooting from 8AC meant that they scored 13 goals in one match!

The Year 9 students are more experienced players, and this meant that the matches were fast paced and the girls worked together as cohesive teams.

The teams were able to move confidently about the courts to intercept and defend well. 9HS scored particularly highly.

Previously Looked After Children



If your child has previously been in the care of a Local Authority in England or Wales and has an adoption, Special Guardianship or Child Arrangements Order, they are entitled to extra support through Pupil Premium Plus funding. Currently, the amount is £2,630 per student and it must be spent to improve outcomes for previously looked after children. It is important to note that the funding is not ring-fenced for the individual child, which allows the school flexibility to ensure it has maximum impact. As the parent or carer, you must declare your child's status and provide evidence of the legal order to us in order for us to claim the funding. You and your child are also entitled to support from our Designated Teacher (Mrs Claire Dowsett), and from the Essex Virtual School. If you wish to have a conversation about your child, we will treat the information with the strictest confidence. 
School Uniform


