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
## A Celebration of Culture and Community

## Year 11 Geography Field Trip



### Year 11 Geography Coastlines in Action Swanage

Year 11 Geography students explored coastal processes first-hand at Swanage, Old Harry, Barton-on-Sea, Lulworth Cove and Stair Hole.

Students measured beach profiles, tracked longshore drift and evaluated how groynes shape sediment movement. At Old Harry, chalk stacks and arches illustrated erosion in action. Barton-on-Sea revealed cliff retreat and slumping, prompting debate about sustainable management. Lulworth Cove and nearby Stair Hole showcased differential erosion and a cove - in-the-making.

Throughout, behaviour was excellent, teamwork strong, and curiosity high—everyone had a genuinely great time while doing serious geography.

Next up: data write-ups and analysis, turning field observations into confident GCSE case studies and exam-ready skills.


#### Help for Hardship - A Shared Effort of Love

Help for Hardship is a community effort to help everyday people. This organisation seeks to fund outdoor essential supplies for the many people that are enduring hardship and sleeping rough on the streets of London.

Help for Hardship is an organisation Caleb's uncle, Michael Morgan set up to support people experiencing homelessness in London. Caleb often goes out with him to hand out care packs, and film this outreach for the social media platforms in order to raise awareness of the issues facing those on the streets in London.

*"Every day in London, we see people enduring the unimaginable reality of sleeping rough. Cold pavements, biting winds, long nights with little comfort... it's hardship in its truest form. And while none of us can take away all the struggles they face, together we offer relief, dignity, and warmth".*

The videos that Caleb produces are not just updates, they show how the movement is growing, the support available (and needed) in the hope that this will



bring in donations, and encourage people to either give a one-off amount via the [GoFundMe](#) page or join the regular giving on Patreon, so that the charity can help more people, more consistently.

The packs distributed focus on practical essentials: Tesco Saver Cards, thermal base layer clothing, sleeping bags, and thermal 'Heat Holder' socks.

This year, the need is even greater. Winters are harsher, weather is more extreme, and every small act of compassion can help someone survive a season of hardship.




## Mrs King Food Technician




There is a small overdraft facility on the ParentPay accounts of £2 for emergency situations which covers the cost of a roll. Due to the cashless system in place, there is no other back up.





As winter continues, we want to ensure that you are prepared for your PE lessons. We are not always lucky enough to have an indoor space, so please come prepared to be outside with the above kit.


In extreme weather, we will endeavour to use a classroom space as an option.
