## Club of the Week – Dance Club

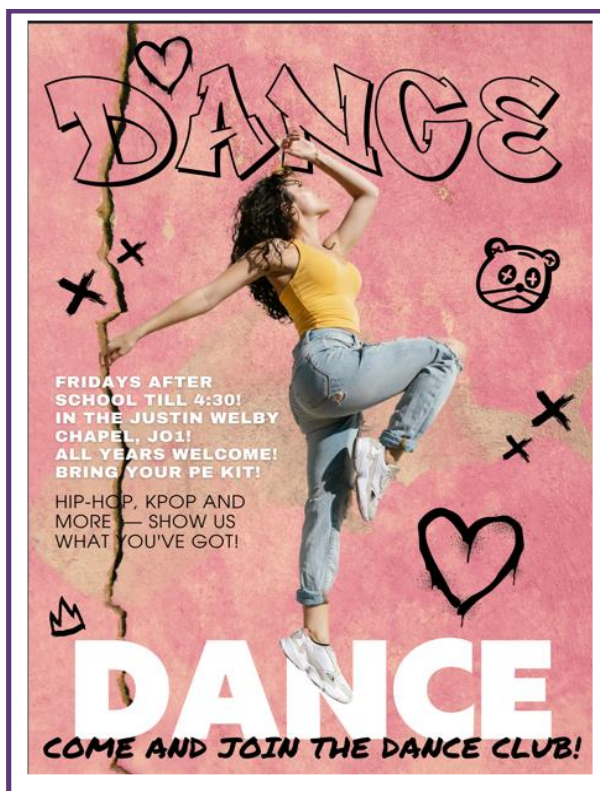
Looking for a place to have fun and express yourself? Then Dance Club is the place for you!

## Student Achievement – Finley Perry

### Kilimanjaro and Zanzibar – Charity Expedition

My name is Finley Perry and I am 14 years old. I am currently in Year 10 at Becket Keys School in Brentwood.

I have recently returned from Tanzania, where I climbed Mount Kilimanjaro, the world's tallest free-standing mountain at 19,341 feet (5,895m) above sea level.



There were five of us in the group: myself, my dad Alan, Suki Dulai, Pareshe Mehta and Sam Amore. Together, we have raised over £100,000 for our chosen charities. My chosen charity was Havens Hospices, who helped care for my nan, Janice Perry, during her battle with cancer last year.

The climb took five days to reach the summit, and every day was very tough in different ways. On the first day, we completed a



seven-hour hike through the rainforest to our first camp. When we arrived, we were greeted by our amazing team of porters, who welcomed us by singing and dancing traditional songs.

Each day involved walking for many hours, usually over ten hours a day. To keep our spirits up while walking, we listened to music, told jokes, sang and shared stories about our lives. I was lucky because I actually slept quite well in the tents, even though it was very cold at night. The rest of the team did not enjoy that part as much! The food was surprisingly really good, and we always looked forward to sitting together in the mess tent, eating, talking about the day and playing cards.

On the fourth day we had to climb along a cliff edge and reached a section called "Kissing Wall". The path is very narrow and you have to stay extremely

close to the rock face, basically "kissing" the wall, because there is a 200-foot drop next to you.

That day we hiked for 15 hours and arrived at camp at 5:30pm. The temperature changed a lot, from around 20°C in the sun to about -20°C when the sun went down or went behind the clouds. After dinner, we went straight to bed because our final climb started at 11pm that night.



The final day was the hardest of all. We had very little sleep, it was pitch black and freezing cold, and



all we could see were other climbers' head torches in front of us. It took 10 hours to reach the summit, but when we got there the feeling was unbelievable and something I will never forget.



After taking some photos, we started our journey back down the mountain.

Unfortunately, on the way down I became very unwell and disoriented. Because I am still young, my lungs are not fully developed and I struggled to get

enough oxygen into my body. My oxygen levels dropped below 40% and I was diagnosed with HACE (high-altitude cerebral oedema) at Barafu Camp.

I was given oxygen on the mountain and continued down to Mweka Camp. As my condition was not improving, I was then taken by emergency helicopter to hospital, where I received further treatment. I am now fully recovered, although it was a very scary experience for my dad and the rest of the team.

Even with what happened on the last day, it is still the best experience of my life.

After Kilimanjaro, we travelled to Zanzibar where we visited a local village. We contacted local schools, football clubs and an

orphanage to let them know we were coming. We gave out over 400 football kits, footballs and pumps to children and adults in the community.



Many of the children were my age or younger and were wearing ripped clothes and no shoes. When they received the football kits and equipment, they were so happy and excited. We organised a penalty shoot-out and played a football match with them, which was amazing.

It was a very humbling experience and made me realise how lucky we are to live where we do.



We have continued to support the community by sending care packages to the orphanage, including school supplies and new football training equipment.

This whole adventure is something I will never forget.

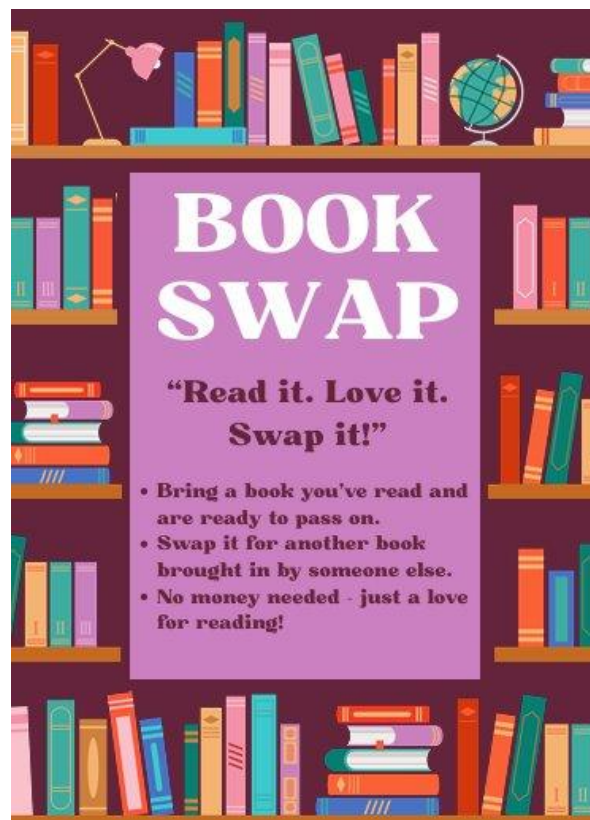
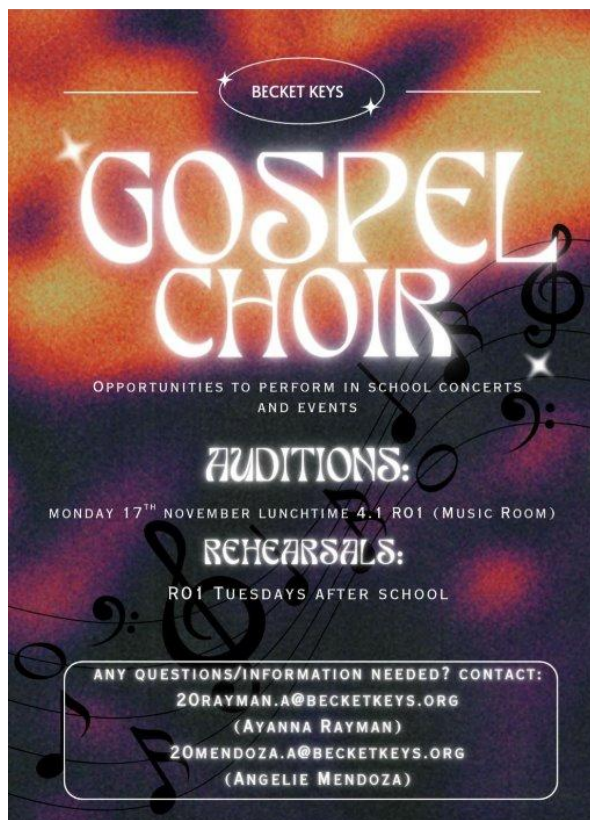

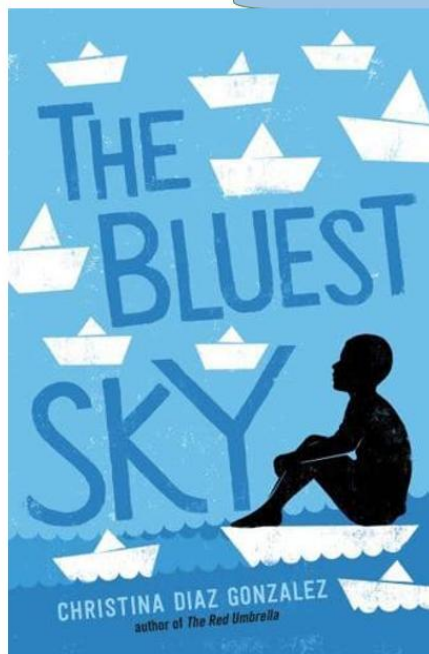
