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



watching 'The Chosen', I am confident you will appreciate this book. Unlike 'The Chosen', it does not include additional storylines but instead stays closely aligned to the words of Jesus and the events recorded in the Gospels.

I also continue to recommend both the book and film 'The Case for Christ' to our school community. This compelling narrative follows an investigative journalist's quest to prove the Gospel untrue only for him to discover instead the truth of Jesus' resurrection.

For those looking for a shorter, more reflective experience, I would like to suggest the videos we often use during Collective Worship at this time of year: [The Last Supper](#), [The Crucifixion](#), and [The Resurrection](#). Each provides a powerful account of the key moments in the Easter story.

Finally, anyone seeking an even more solemn contemplation may wish to listen to 'Miserere Mei Deus'. This sacred piece offers a poignant reminder of the solemnity and significance of this holy time. I encourage you to listen to it this weekend and explore the 400-year-old story behind it. We often use this piece for quiet reflection in school.



In closing, I want to express my heartfelt appreciation to our entire school community for embracing the spirit of Lent with reverence and enthusiasm. As we conclude Passiontide and celebrate Easter, may you all know God's blessing upon you.

## Year 10 – History Trip

On Friday 20<sup>th</sup> March, 75 Year 10 history students visited Ypres in Belgium. It was a brilliant, jam-packed day, which started off with the coaches departing from school at 4am!

Our first stop was to a British cemetery with about 10,000 graves in it, from only one hospital near the front lines. It was very poignant to see the rows and rows of individual graves, knowing that each told a different story, from many different countries.



Next, we visited the German cemetery Langemark, allowing us to see the differences between the two cemeteries, with the German one containing almost 44,000 bodies, with about 20 cremated men per grave. We then went to the Hodge Crater museum, where we explored a recreation of the British trenches. It was interesting to see the zig zag pattern of the trenches, and interesting to navigate through them, just like the soldiers.



Then, we had a small memorial service at the Menin gate, led by Reverend Cannon Darren Barlow, where we all took a minute to remember everything that the soldiers did for us.

Finally, we went into the main town of Ypres and stopped off at a chocolate shop called Leonidas, where most of us bought some delicious chocolates as a souvenir.

Thanks to Miss Risdon and the history department for organising a great trip.

- Explore the local area – can they see themselves there?



### Ski Trip to Hotel Miramonti in Passo Del Tonale, Italy, March/April 2027

Have you been inspired by the Winter Olympics? Would you be interested in sending your son or daughter skiing with the school in 2027? We are considering organising a new ski trip for students in Year 10 and above (current Year 9 and above) to the wonderful resort of Hotel Miramonti in Passo Del Tonale for 2027. This would be a new additional ski trip different to the bi-annual trip to Sugarloaf Mountain, Maine in USA.



Our trip would see us staying at Hotel Miramonti. It is a high quality option with good rooms and plenty of hotel facilities and it is also perfectly located opposite the slopes. It also comes with a disco night, pizza night and access to a swimming pool.



With skiing up to 3050 metres, it is one of the highest ski areas in Europe as it offers Glacier skiing meaning the snow is secure all season. The ski school is highly regarded as one of the best for school groups in Italy and they will offer us 5 hours of tuition per day.

LOIS LOWRY

Jonas who lives in a society free of crime and sadness. At the age of 12, children are assigned their jobs, which they will train for and do for the rest of their lives. Everything is chosen; from your parents to your partner. Jonas stands apart from the community when he is chosen to become the new "Memory Keeper". Society has been kept free of all the negative aspects of life because for as long as it has been formed, there has been someone who holds all memories of the past within them to protect society from harm.

This book shows the path of growing up; at first, we are scared to accept that there are new responsibilities, but as we get used to it, we want to move more and more away from childhood. Jonas must make choices for himself; as will you at the end of the book.

I would recommend this book to anyone who loves dystopian worlds, and well as people who like a book to let them think for themselves! (The Giver is the first in a series of four, which is available as a boxset).
