Mr Scott-Evans writes.....

Student Voice: The results are in!

Last week, I wrote to you all about the recent parent survey and I remain very grateful to everyone who has already taken the time to respond. [Parent View](#) is still open, and I still would like parents and carers to share their views with us. This week, however, I want to focus on the voices of our students.

I am very pleased to report that the student survey has been extremely well supported, with 394 responses from students across every year group from Year 7 to Year 13. That strong, balanced participation matters a lot, because it gives us a rich and honest picture of how students experience life at Becket Keys.

The responses paint a very encouraging picture. More than 9 in 10 students said that they enjoy school and a very similar proportion said that the feedback they receive from teachers helps them to improve. Around 94% said that their teachers help them to do their best, while only around 1 in 50 gave a negative response to that question. On the important matter of safety, only 3 students said that they don't feel safe at school. We will follow up with them, of course.

There was also very strong affirmation across a number of other key areas. Around 9 in 10 students gave a positive response when asked about conduct in lessons, conduct around the school, fairness,

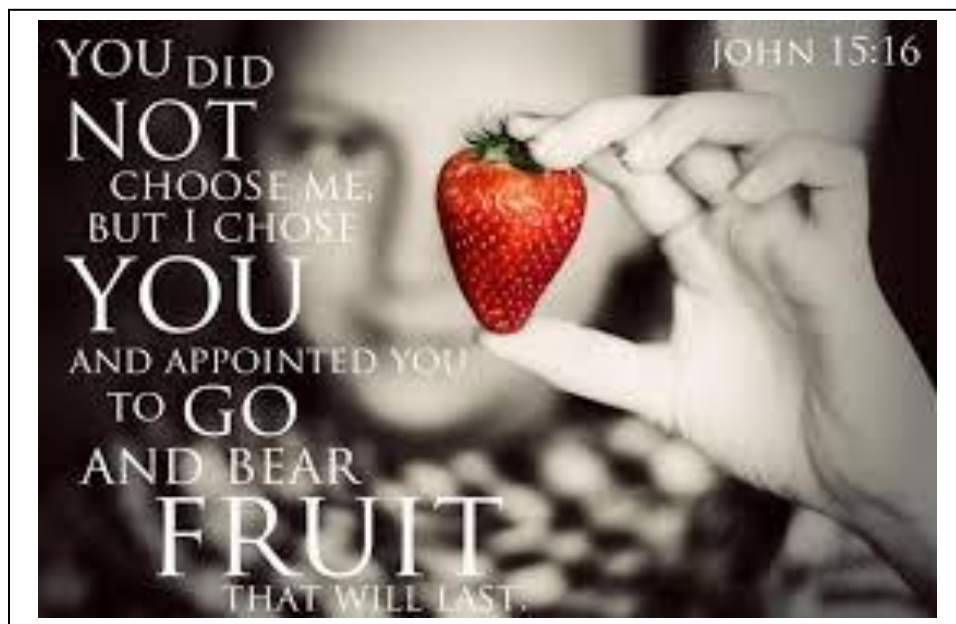

bullying, and the support they receive to learn well. Taken together, these responses speak warmly of a school where students feel supported by their teachers, where learning matters, and where the day-to-day experience of school is positive for the great majority of young people.

I was particularly pleased that this feedback reflects so much of who we strive to be as a school. We are a school where the motto Faith in Learning is taken seriously, and our Christian ethos shapes our relationships, our expectations and our care for one another. Our school Bible verse, John 15:16–17, reminds us that each person is chosen, known and called to bear good fruit. In many ways, the student responses suggest that these values are not simply words on a page, but something students experience each day in the life of the school.

The feedback also reflects our four strategic filters in action. We are:

- a church school, with a clear moral purpose and Christian foundation
- a school with an independent school feel, where high expectations and professionalism matter
- a school strengthened by the support and challenge of RET (our expert trust)



- and, at the centre of it all, a school where every student is known by name

At the same time, student voice helps us to keep refining what we do. One theme we will continue to emphasise is helping every student feel fully confident that they can speak to an adult whenever they need to. The survey shows a strong foundation here, but we want that confidence to be absolute.

That is why we will keep reminding students that every adult in school with a lanyard is there to listen, support and act with care. Students are welcomed at the Downs Gate each day, supported by teachers at break and lunch, and surrounded by adults throughout the school day. They can speak to any of us in corridors, before or after school, in classrooms, at break, at or over lunch. They can also write to our staff through Satchel One or by using the school [contact page](#) on our website.

As ever, listening matters. As a school community, we grow stronger when we listen with honesty, care and respect. I am grateful to all the students who completed the survey so thoughtfully, and I am proud that their responses show so much that is good about Becket Keys.

Leave a lasting legacy in our library!

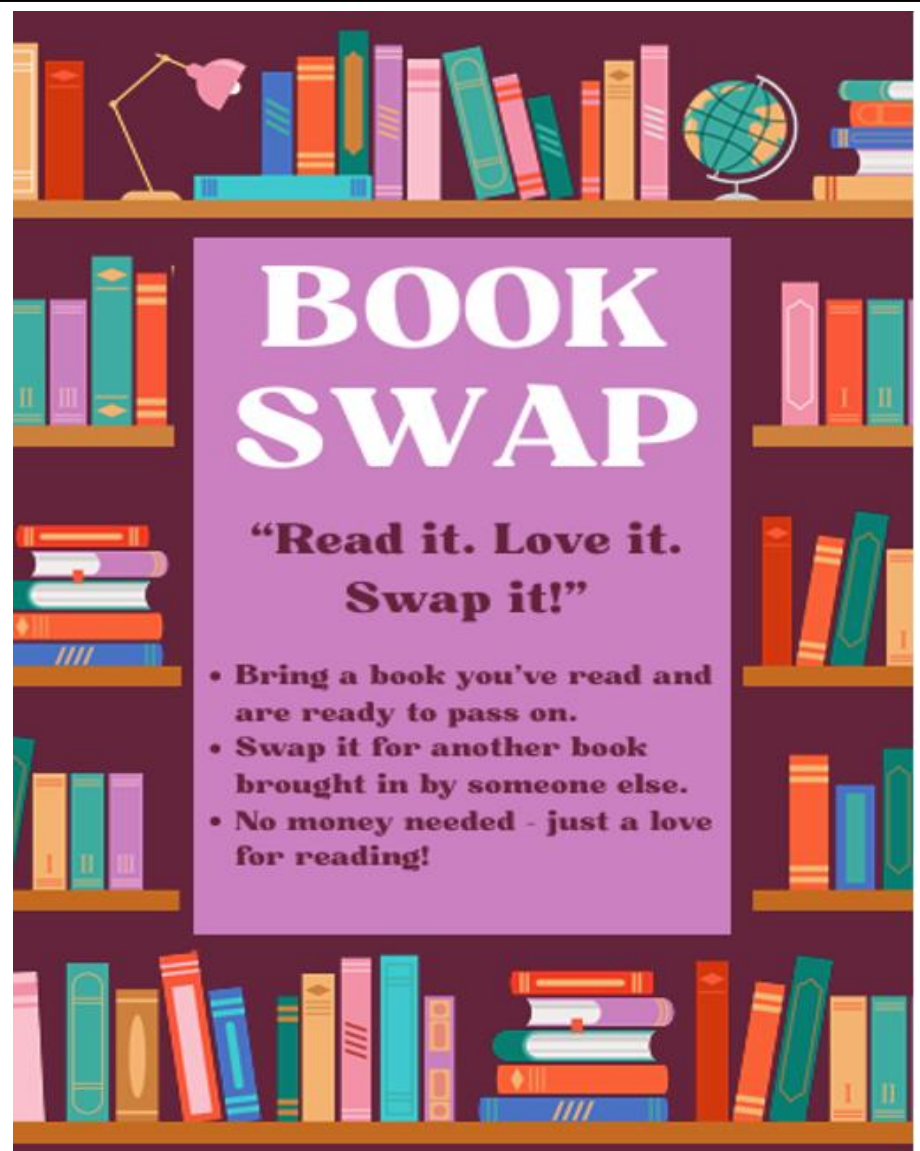
As part of our ongoing commitment to fostering a love of reading, we are inviting every student to donate a book to the school as they depart for their next adventures.

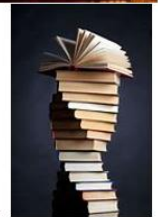

Drama Department – Theatre Trip



Yesterday a group of drama students from Year 10 and Year 12 travelled to Stratford East theatre with Mrs Barr to see a production of Choir Boy.



From Academy Award-winning writer Tarell Alvin McCraney (*Moonlight, The Brother/Sister Plays*), comes this exhilarating and tender coming of age story. Nancy Medina’s celebrated production premiered at Bristol Old Vic in 2023 and won three *Black British Theatre*

Awards including Best Production and Best Director.

Pharus is a confident and gifted singer who has earned his position as soloist. But when his pride is sullied by one of his peers, he falters... what does it mean to be a young, black man – and to be one at the Charles R. Drew Prep School for Boys?

We’re sent on an electrifying journey through the growing pains of humanity as, together, the boys navigate spirituality, sexuality, race, identity, and brotherhood in their journey to becoming men. Threaded throughout with soul-stirring a cappella gospel hymns and spirituals, this beautiful, joyous play rejoices in all that it means to march to your own drum.

The production was extremely entertaining. The singing was amazing and the acting was really strong. The plot gave us an insight into the struggles of homosexual people in school and was inspirational to see how he dealt with discrimination. The play also showed us the emotions of people who battle with race identity and bereavement.

Choir Boy at Stratford Theatre was a thought-provoking spectacle that blended controversial themes with intricate theatrical techniques. I was powerfully moved by the decisions that the director made in all segments of the play as the compelling storyline paired with the gospel inspired music made for a

delightful performance. It interestingly tackled Spiritualists and how tradition of the church directly hindered its advancements. Carefully woven through the plot, character's hamartia's and emotional cores were revealed to us as an audience. Each minute detail was heightened and built upon during the play and was able to be pieced together but not predictably – requiring attention to detail to realise.

I was impressed by the vocality of the performers and the captivating choice to blend Afro American slave melodies with the traditional and well-known music the Church proudly boasts nowadays. Overall, I would like to go again and thought the experience and the play was both powerful and necessary in the society we live in.

Student Achievement – Daniel Ellis Year 10

Daniel has been a dedicated member of Brentwood Sea Cadet Unit (TS St Vincent) for three and a half years, and during that time he has achieved an impressive range of accomplishments.



Over the past year, Daniel has completed three week-long offshore voyages, living and working aboard the Sea Cadets' specialised motor vessel TS John Jerwood, their flagship vessel TS Royalist, a 32-metre, two-masted, steel-hulled brig, and most recently over Easter aboard one of the Sea Cadets' Yachts. Sailing along the south coast between Ramsgate and Weymouth, exploring the Solent, Daniel played an active role as crew while developing strong seamanship skills. He has now earned his Offshore Hand Level 1 qualification on all three vessel types.

Daniel's achievements ashore and on the water are equally notable. He has gained his Powerboat Licence, which qualifies him to independently command

powerboats of up to 10 metres in length. He has also passed his Paddle Explore qualification and will soon undertake his Safety and Rescue training, a pathway towards qualifying as a kayaking instructor. Daniel has also acquired his Level 2 Sailing qualification.



In addition, Daniel earned his Intermediate Catering Badge, which included the responsibility of preparing and serving meals for VIP guests over a residential weekend.

Daniel plays an active role in ceremonial and community events representing the unit at Remembrance Day parades and recently parading with his unit on Whitehall for the prestigious St George's Day Parade.



At the unit's Annual Awards, Daniel received special recognition for an outstanding 191 hours on the water and was also named Cadet's Cadet of the Year, voted for by his peers. He is also a recipient of the Jack Petchey Award for his leadership, teamwork and contribution to the unit and wider community.

Daniel also mentors junior cadets in Boatswain Piping, contributing to their success in achieving Gold at District level and Silver at Area level.

Daniel has progressed through multiple ranks as a Senior Cadet, recently being promoted to Able Cadet—a significant accomplishment for someone of his age. This required the successful completion of over 40 modules including Leadership, First Aid and Seamanship. He has also achieved his BTEC Level 1 in Teamwork, Personal Skills and Citizenship.



As a Senior Cadet, Daniel has been selected to attend the National Cadet Conference in Doncaster later this year, where hundreds of cadets from across the country will gather to help shape the future of the organisation, share ideas and participate in leadership workshops.

Looking ahead, Daniel will be undertaking two weekend expeditions over the coming months as he works towards his Silver Duke of Edinburgh's Award and will also be attending his fourth offshore voyage during October half term.



Through his involvement with the Sea Cadets, Daniel has embraced a wide range of exciting and rewarding opportunities. These experiences have enabled him to develop confidence, resilience, leadership and lifelong life skills—qualities that will undoubtedly support him in his future ambition to join the Royal Marines.

From Becket Keys to Dental School

We were blessed on Wednesday to welcome back a very special visiting speaker: former Becket Keys student, Temi Esho.

Speaking to our Year 11 students, Temi shared her powerful journey *from Becket Keys to dental school*, offering encouragement, honesty, and faith filled wisdom at a crucial time as students prepare for their upcoming exams and next steps.

During her address, Temi reflected on three key messages.

The value of Becket Keys

Temi spoke with gratitude about her time at Becket Keys, describing it as a place where teachers genuinely knew her, supported her, and cared about her as an individual rather than a grade or statistic. She shared how this love and encouragement provided a strong foundation for her future, and why she still returns to visit staff – to thank them and to remind them of the lasting impact they have on the lives and ambitions of their students.

It always gets better

Temi was open about the challenges she faced after leaving Becket Keys, including significant setbacks during her A level studies, when the pandemic meant exams were cancelled and grades did not reflect her true ability. Despite missed

opportunities and uncertainty about her future, Temi showed real resilience. Through determination, hard work, and perseverance, she adapted her plans and continued to push forward, a powerful reminder that setbacks do not define us, and that difficult seasons do not last forever.

God has a plan for your life

Faith has been central to Temi's journey. She shared how trusting God's plans sustained her during moments of disappointment and confusion, bringing peace, direction, and hope when the path ahead seemed unclear. Her unwavering faith was a clear source of strength and purpose, resonating deeply with our students and staff.

Temi is now a final year dental student, recognised by her



university as one of its most prominent students. Alongside her studies, she has received international recognition, including an award from Harvard University, an invitation to the House of Commons, and she has founded her own health and edtech business all by the age of 24!

Her story was a timely and inspiring reminder to our Year 11 students that success does not follow a single, straight path, and that with faith, resilience, and hard work, great things are possible.
