### Safeguarding: Everyone's Responsibility

At Becket Keys Church of England School, one of our most important responsibilities is keeping children safe.

Parents rightly place enormous trust in our school, and safeguarding sits at the heart of everything. It is not simply a matter of policy; it is about creating a Christian community and culture where every child is known, valued, listened to and protected. Our safeguarding work is guided by our Christian ethos and by the words of Jesus in our school Bible verse:

*"You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit – fruit that will last... This is my*

*command: Love each other."* (John 15:16-17)

Every day, we strive to build a school community where students feel safe, respected and supported so that they can thrive academically, socially, emotionally and spiritually.

Our Safeguarding and Child Protection Policy, which is published on the school website, sets out the extensive measures we take to protect students and promote their welfare. This includes regular staff training, robust reporting procedures, close partnership working with external agencies and a strong safeguarding culture across the school. The policy also identifies our Designated Safeguarding Lead, Mrs Sally Trebess, and the wider safeguarding team who

## Teaching Students How to Keep Themselves Safe

Safeguarding is not only about responding to concerns; it is also about education and prevention.

Our weekly PSHE programme and daily tutorials play a vital role in helping students understand how to keep themselves safe in our complex world. Through these lessons, students learn about healthy relationships, online safety, wellbeing, personal responsibility, consent, respect for others, managing risk and seeking help when they need it.

These are all essential. They equip young people with the knowledge and confidence they need to navigate life safely and wisely.

We recognise that Relationship and Sex Education (RSE) can be an area where parents have questions. We want to work openly and positively with families. Parents are always welcome to contact the school if they would like to discuss our curriculum. We are happy to show parents the materials we use and can arrange for specific resources to be viewed on request. All our materials are aligned with the strong Christian ethos parents would expect in a school like ours.

## Uniform, Expectations and Keeping School Safe

Safeguarding is also supported by the high expectations we set as a school community.

Our [Uniform Policy](#) and [Banned Items](#) List are not just rules; they are important tools in helping us maintain a safe, orderly and purposeful environment. Clear expectations around appearance and equipment help students focus on learning, reduce opportunities for conflict and ensure that school is always a safe place for everyone.

We ask all families to familiarise themselves with these policies and to support the school. When home and school work together consistently, students benefit enormously.

Whether you are a parent, carer, teacher, governor, support staff member or student, we all have a role to play in creating a culture where we all feel safe, valued and able to thrive.

# Parent Workshops

## For parents of students in Year 7-10

We would like to remind you about our upcoming Parent Workshops taking place on **Tuesday, 9th June from 6:00–7:00pm**. We are very much looking forward to welcoming you and hope as many of you as possible will be able to attend.

These workshops are designed to provide an informal and supportive environment where parents can explore practical strategies, share experiences, and gain valuable insights into supporting their children. Members of the Senior Leadership Team will be leading a range of short sessions on the following topics:

- **Online safety and mobile phones:** This workshop will support parents in understanding the risks and benefits of mobile phone use, and how to help children stay safe and responsible online.

- **Character Education and the Teenage Brain:** This session will explore how the teenage brain develops and how parents can nurture resilience, values and positive behaviour.

- **What is an EHCP?:** This workshop will explain what an Education, Health and Care Plan is, how it works and how parents can support their child through the process.

- **Years 9 and 10 – thinking ahead to Sixth Form and beyond:** This session will guide parents on key decisions, pathways, and how to support their child in planning for future education and careers.

- **The power of silence – taking a break from the busyness of the world:** This workshop will highlight the benefits of rest, reflection, and quiet time, and how families can build moments of calm into daily life.

Each session will last 20 minutes and will be repeated three times throughout the evening, allowing you to attend up to three different sessions. Light refreshments will also be available. 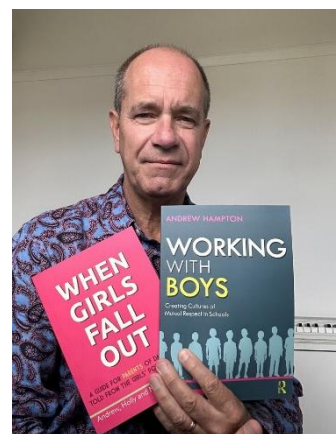

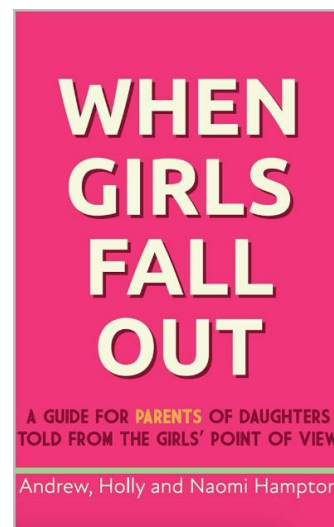

## Mock Interviews

## Book of the Month - June



Elias is fourteen, and his brain is a swamp of fears and bad things. He adores his older brother, Bo, but Bo has become a stranger, his parents are arguing, his dad has moved to the city for a promotion - all Elias knows is that his family is failing apart.

After getting into trouble at school and then losing his job at the local wood mill, Bo has become entangled with some dangerous people. Elias becomes convinced that the way to fix everything is to win the school talent competition - and with it the prize of a family dinner at a local pizza restaurant – but what begins as a simple pizza-night dream quickly spirals into chaos beyond belief.

But despite hard knocks and disappointment, with love and support from the people around him, Elias begins to realise that family bonds can endure even the toughest tests.

Set during a particularly brutal winter in the wilds of Canada, the relentless weather mirrors the harshness of life in a small town where everyone knows you or thinks they do. This is a novel about finding yourself, building confidence, and learning who you can trust - all told with warmth and threaded with sharp, observational humour.

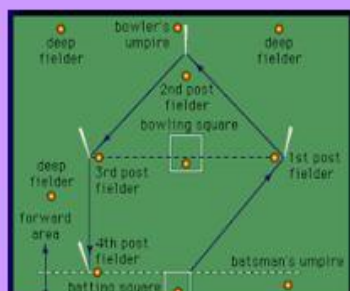
