New School Building Names for Becket Keys

As you are aware, over the past few months we have been undertaking an important project at Becket Keys: the renaming of our school buildings.



THE CHURCH OF ENGLAND

As a Church of England school, we wanted our physical environment to reflect clearly who we are and what we stand for. Renaming our buildings has given us an opportunity to align our spaces more closely with our Christian vision, our guiding Bible verse (John 15:16–17), and our

desire to be a worshipping, Eucharistic Christian community

The early stages of this work was led by students, with small working groups drawn from the School Council, Senior Prefects and Christian Union. These students, supported by staff and chaplains were asked to consider why particular names would be appropriate and how they reflect our values and Christian ethos.

Students were encouraged to explore names drawn from places of significance within the Christian faith, such as places associated with pilgrimage or prayer, and following consultation with governors and diocesan advisers we have ensured the outcomes are thoughtful, coherent,

and appropriate for the long term.



Anglican Places of Worship

Our school buildings will be named after five of the UK's most important Anglican churches, chosen to reflect both history and purpose of each one.

Canterbury Cathedral, the 'mother church', represents leadership, unity, and guidance at the heart of the school.

Westminster Abbey celebrates shared experience. Students come together in the main hall, eat together in the restaurant, and enjoy the various classrooms.

Durham Cathedral represents the meeting of faith and scholarship, reflecting a place where intellectual curiosity and spiritual depth grow together. Housing the chapel and Sixth Form, it's name evokes thoughtful reflection, academic ambition, and preparation for life beyond school. **York Minster** with its incredible architecture and stained glass inspires creativity and imagination, supporting music, drama, art & textiles. **Salisbury Cathedral's** spire may be said to encourage

aspiration. That might suit perseverance and teamwork in our sports and PE facilities. Together, these names could help tell the story of faith, learning, and inspiration for all. They also pass the important 'corridor test' – can students actually use these as place names? Yes, because they are!



THE CANTERBURY CATHEDRAL BUILDING

1. Canterbury Cathedral – Carey - The Central Hub – Offices, Toilets, Library, English, MFL

Canterbury Cathedral, the home of the Anglican Community, has guided faith for over 1400 years. As the seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury, it represents leadership, wisdom, and unity. Placing its name on the central building of the school reflects how this space acts as the heart of our school: offices, library, English, and languages. Just as Canterbury connects churches worldwide, our building connects students, staff, and learning, offering guidance, resources, and support. Its historical and spiritual depth reminds us that leadership is rooted in service providing the perfect starting point for anyone

entering and moving through the school.

THE WESTMINSTER ABBEY BUILDING

2. Westminster Abbey – Williams Building – Main Hall, Restaurants, Science, DT, Food, Computer Science, Economics & Business.

Westminster Abbey has been the centre of national life in England for nearly a thousand years. Coronations, royal weddings, and state funerals all take place there, making it a symbol of community and ceremony. Naming the Williams Building after Westminster Abbey highlights its role as a space for gathering: main hall, restaurants and learning. Just as Westminster Abbey unites people in shared experience, our building fosters communal life, collective learning, and celebrations. Students meet, eat, and worship together here. The building embodies connection, traditions and shared purpose, echoing the Abbey's importance in the national life.



THE DURHAM CATHEDRAL BUILDING



3. Durham Cathedral – Welby - Sixth Form & Chapel - Mathematics, History, Geography, Politics, Psychology, Sixth Form, Chapel

Durham Cathedral, with Norman architecture and a shrine to St Cuthbert, is known as a centre of spirituality, learning, and prayerful reflection. Its soaring arches and quiet chapels inspire us to contemplation and study. Using Durham's name for the Sixth Form building, which includes the John Wraw chapel, the sixth form areas, humanities, and mathematics departments, reflects this dual identity: intellectual pursuit alongside spiritual formation. Just as Durham has educated generations and served as a pilgrimage destination, our building encourages students to grow academically, morally, and spiritually. Silent study spaces and the chapel provide space for spiritual growth, while classrooms nurture learning and academic excellence. Durham reminds us that faith and intellect flourish together.

THE YORK MINSTER BUILDING

4. York Minster – Runcie Building – Drama, Art, Music, Textiles, RP

York Minster is a masterpiece of Gothic architecture, celebrated for its stained glass, intricate carvings, and storytelling through art. Its grandeur embodies creativity, imagination, and the power of expression. Naming the Runcie Building after York Minster aligns beautifully with its purpose: music, drama, art, textiles, and Religious Education. Students explore ideas, emotions, and culture, just as visitors to the Minster experience narratives and inspiration through windows and sculptures. The building becomes a space where creativity is nurtured, collaboration encouraged, and expression celebrated. York reminds students to reach for excellence in artistry and communication, fostering confidence and imagination that illuminate both individual talent and shared achievement.



THE SALISBURY SPORTS HALL



5. Salisbury Cathedral – Sports Hall

Salisbury Cathedral is famed for its soaring spire (the tallest in England). It represents ambition, discipline and the pursuit of excellence. The cathedral is known for elegant proportions, and harmonious design. Its architecture draws eyes upward, inspiring awe and aspiration. Naming the Sports Hall after Salisbury links physical energy, teamwork, and ambition to this sense of reaching higher, going faster and further. Just as the Salisbury spire dominates the skyline, the sports hall represents excellence, perseverance, and striving toward goals. Students learn discipline, resilience, and cooperation while participating in sports and physical education, mirroring the cathedral's grandeur and inspirational presence. Salisbury reminds us that effort, dedication, and vision can lift communities and individuals alike, creating a space where achievement and aspiration flourish together.

Becket Keys welcomes survivor from the Holocaust Educational Trust

On 9th July 2026, students from Year 9 will hear testimony from Holocaust survivor, Tom Keve as part of a visit organised by the Holocaust Educational Trust (HET).

The testimony will be followed by a question and answer session to enable students to better understand the nature of the Holocaust and to explore its lessons in more depth. The visit is part of the Holocaust Educational Trust's extensive all year round Outreach Programme, which is available to schools across the UK.

Mr Bay (Head of History) has said:

"It is a privilege for us to welcome Mr Keve back to our school, his testimony will provide a powerful reminder of the horrors so many experienced. We are grateful to the

Holocaust Educational Trust for co-ordinating the visit and we hope that by hearing Tom's testimony, it will encourage our students to learn from the lessons of the Holocaust and make a positive difference in their own lives."



Karen Pollock CBE, Chief Executive of the Holocaust Educational Trust added:

"The Holocaust Educational Trust educates and engages students from across the UK, from all communities about the Holocaust and there can be no better way than through the first-hand testimony of a survivor. Tom's story is one of tremendous courage during horrific circumstances and by hearing his testimony, students will have the opportunity to learn where prejudice and racism can ultimately lead.

"At the Trust, we impart the history of the Holocaust to young people, to ensure that we honour the memory of those whose lives were lost and take forward the lessons taught by those who survived."

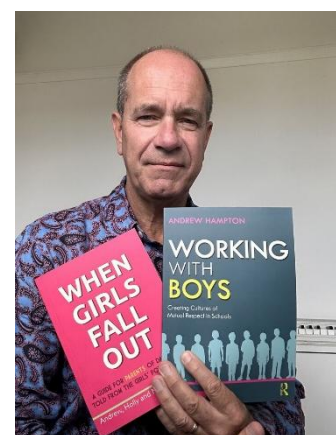

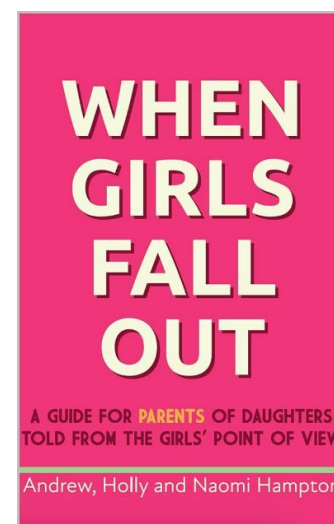

Book of the Month - June



Elias is fourteen, and his brain is a swamp of fears and bad things. He adores his older brother, Bo, but Bo has become a stranger, his parents are arguing, his dad has moved to the city for a promotion - all Elias knows is that his family is failing apart.

After getting into trouble at school and then losing his job at the local wood mill, Bo has become entangled with some dangerous people. Elias becomes convinced that the way to fix everything is to win the school talent competition - and with it the prize of a family dinner at a local pizza restaurant – but what begins as a simple pizza-night dream quickly spirals into chaos beyond belief.

But despite hard knocks and disappointment, with love and support from the people around him, Elias begins to realise that family bonds can endure even the toughest tests.

Set during a particularly brutal winter in the wilds of Canada, the relentless weather mirrors the harshness of life in a small town where everyone knows you or thinks they do. This is a novel about finding yourself, building confidence, and learning who you can trust - all told with warmth and threaded with sharp, observational humour.

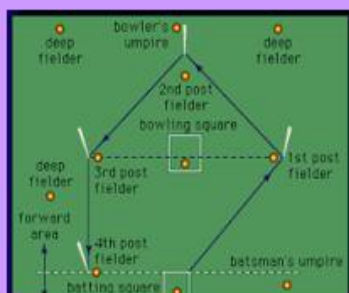
